Charolais Banner Nov. 1989 - The Harry Airey family's 1,200 acres farm includes some grain farming land. They began using a Charolais bull on some commercial cows in 1970. In 1973 Harry bought four 3/4 blood heifers and began "breeding up". Since the mid 1970's the commercial cattle have disappeared and HTA now has 60 purebred cows.

It was in 1956 that I first heard of Charolais and this came through a picture in the Western Producer. I am very pleased to have been present at the organizational meeting of the Canadian Charolais Association which was held in Calgary in 1959.

My brothers and I purchased our first Charolais in 1958. Then I got what all Charolais breeders' wives call "White Fever", a disease you never seem to shake.

I met Marg at the Wainwright Stampede in June 1960. At that time she was my girlfriend's girlfriend. Well!!

I purchased the home place from my father in September 1960 and at this time my brother George moved to his present location. I spent the winter buying Holstein calves in the Fraser Valley, keeping an eye on my cattle and horses at home, and in between doing this, I was courting Marg. We were married in Medicine Hat in June 1961 (the temperature was 103 degrees on our wedding day) and settled on the home place. In the fall of 1962, Roy moved to his present location and in the spring of 1963 my parents moved into their new home in Marsden. Marg and I have been to France for the past three summers, selecting cattle for importation. I endeavor to take in as many of the Charolais activities and meetings as possible. I am an active life member of the American International Association and Performance Registry International, plus an active member of the Canadian Charolais Association and the Saskatchewan Charolais Association.

Charolais are my living; but my family is my life. We have many happy hours together, singing, hunting, riding, tenting and when it comes to hauling bales, it's a family affair.

In the Oct./Nov. 1964 Charolais Newsletter Roy Biensch wrote: I was raised on a farm at Artland, SK where I resided until 1962 when we moved not far to our present site "Rainbow Ranch". Until this time I was in partnership with my father & three brothers. In my younger years I spent much of my time taking part in sports - baseball, hockey & hunting. In 1954 Joan and I took the big step of matrimony and since then have been blessed with three health children. After reading many articles in U.S. magazines, we decided in 1958 to go on a tour in Canada and the U.S. to see some Charolais herds. Following this we purchased a purebred bull at Pincher Creek, and later on that fall, went to Idaho and purchased five head of percentage females. Two of these were to have calves to register in the spring, so we joined the AICA. On January 16, 1959 we received a letter from John Ballachey, that there was to be an organizational meeting in Calgary on January 17 to form a Canadian Association which was good news. There was a mix-up in the address so that we received the letter the night before the meeting. So we were on our way in the wee hours the next morning. It was very encouraging to meet so many people all enthused about the same thing, Charolais. It was a successful day indeed.

In 1961 we purchased a portable scale and have kept our own records of our cattle the first two years. In 1963 we enrolled our entire herd in P.R.I. and have found that I refer to these records frequently in selecting new animals for my breeding herd. I believe that the Charolais are a high performing breed and that we should select with performance records to keep their standards high.

In the Sept. 1966 Charolais Newsletter Frances Borgal wrote: Ev and Francie Borgal here, at Pridalta Stock Farm. Ev would like to call it Pridalta Charolais Ranch, but having lived in these parts all my life I know that ranches are places where people live and don't do too much work and such is not the case here. Ev was a high school teacher at the Lethbridge Collegiate for 13 years and in the Air Force for 5 years and I, a registered nurse and radiographer for 20 odd years. After coming to Priddis in 1957 Ev spent about five years tearing up willow roots with a caterpillar and me picking them up and burning them, so it is no wonder I have that smoke tanned look.

In the spring of 1959 we bought four head of Charbray heifers from Mr.Keith Matz, Holtville, California and that same winter we bought a purebred bull calf from him, the dam of the calf being one that Mr. Metz had sold to Fletcher Bennet of Pincher Creek. He was taking the cow back to Holtville and we were able to talk him into leaving the calf here at Pridalta. He, the bull, proved a very good investment as the first crop of calves we had out of him averaged 90 lbs. each over the straight bred Hereford we had at the time. We then bought 30 head of Angus cows and 20 head of Shorthorns and after using the Charolais bull on all three breeds decided that we liked the Charolais Angus cross the best and have since eliminated the other two breeds.

Before I forget, I must tell you about the first reaction in our neighborhood, which by the way boast some real top breeders of all the other beef breed, including Galloway and Santa Gertudis, to our Charbray Heifers. We have a Welsh neighbour with a very pronounce Gaelic accent and who speaks very slowly. He passed our place the day after our heifers arrived from California and the following is his remark; "In the name of heavens, what have the Borgal's got down there ??? CAAAMELS", (pronounce like that but spelled Camels).

I caught my first Charolais bug on a visit to France in 1956 and it is quite infectious because Ev has caught it too and after his first visit to the American Royal in Kansas City, he is a bigger booster of Charolais than I will ever be.

We run a herd of about 100 cows which we hope will eventually all be Charolais, in a valley known as Oatmeal Valley, which was originally inhabited mostly by Scotchmen, but the only Scotch thing about it now is that Ev still enjoys eating Porridge.

In the July 1965 Charolais Newsletter Shirley Branum wrote: Ray was born in Craigmyle, AB. After completing his schooling there, he graduated from Royal Military College at Kingston, ON. From there he joined the Air Force, piloting Canso aircraft on the East Coast. This was where Ray and I met and married in 1944 in Nova Scotia. We came back to Alberta and rented some land to get our first start at farming. Ray's father ran a sub-experimental station for many years and here is where we first learned of the Charolais breed from none other than Harry Hargrave. Harry would show slides of these animals and in his most interesting talks about them gave Ray ideas that he would like to have some of this blood. He was not satisfied with the size of the cattle we were raising and so what seemed almost the impossible was very soon to be realized.

In a few years we acquired our own farm here at Craigmyle and at the same time we were blessed with our chosen daughter, Linda.

On July 6th, 1957 we imported our first bull and heifer from Keith Mets, at Holtville, CA. I'll never forget the fever of excitement over these. We got them along with a load of cattle that Fletcher Bennett of Pincher Creek also acquired from Keith Mets. We were so impressed with these cattle that we were soon back across the line to Nevada and Arizona to the Frank Campbell ranches to buy more cattle.

It did not seem to take us long to acquire a fairly high percentage cow herd of 60. Ray was always very concerned about performance testing these animals and keeping records on them. In 1963, Ray was able to go to the convention and was honored as having been the "Pioneer" President. That fall he became very ill and passed away on Feb. 3, 1964

The first Charolais arrived via a horse trade involving bred commercial cows. One of the Black Baldie cows threw a pure white percentage Charolais calf. From then on they A.I.'ed to many different breeds, but the Char-cross calves "seemed to grow better". Following the breeding experiment, the enthusiasm for Charolais grew. Circle Cee added their first fullblood Charolais bull in the early 1970's.

The first yellow cattle appeared on 4C Charolais Farm as a result of a purebred Charolais bull leased for 22 days. That bull left 10 calves out of 19 cows. The steer calves were fed out with the Hereford sired contemporaries and when shipped to St. Boniface market netted \$79 per head over the contemporary's average. This made believers in Charolais out of the Clews.

Charolais Banner Sept. 1967 - Here at Craigmyle where the dry, flat east country of Alberta begins, it seems a far cry from the small Ontario town of Kincardine on the shores of Lake Huron, where I was born and raised. Being a town boy, there was not much opportunity to become acquainted with farming, but by working in summer holidays and then for a short time on a farm after my schooling, I managed to develop a liking for farm life which was to wait several years to be developed in earnest. I held a variety of jobs in Kincardine before leaving there in 1953 to spend five years in Indian Schools at Sioux Lookout, ON, Prince Albert, SK, and Wabasca, AB. It was while working in these schools that I met Willa, who hails from Gaspe, PQ., and we were married in Prince Albert.

Leaving Indian work in the spring of 1958, we were employed on a ranch south of Hardisty, AB where I was able to gain practical and valuable experience on farming and ranching operations as practiced in this part of the country and we were there until the fall of 1960 at which time we moved here to work for the Branum's. At that time the only white cows I had seen were white Shorthorn, but it did not take long to get brain-washed. I soon picked up the enthusiasm of my employer and under his expert guidance, it was not long before I was keeping records and waiting for weaning to see if this year's calf from such and such a cow would be better than last year's because she was bred to a different bull.

About a year after Ray's death, Mrs. Branum dispersed the herd which then numbered about 85 white cows, and we were fortunate in being able to purchase 20 head of females along with a bull she had recently purchased from the Char-Rouse Ranch. We felt that with performance tested cattle, we were on the right track and in the three years that we have been renting the Branum farm, we have had no cause to doubt this decision.

I have enjoyed working with the other directors in the Alberta Charolais Association.

Around home I seem to keep busy as I'm President of our F.U.A. Local, Vice President of our Rural Electrification Association and Assistant Leader of our 4 -H Beef Club.

Charolais Banner May 1963 - My public school education was received in a typical one room country school, for I was born and raised on my father's dairy farm in North York Township near Toronto where my ancestors, who were United Empire Loyalists, had settled several years before Confederation. Tending the Holstein herd on a hot summer afternoon, or bringing the cows up the dusty lane from pasture are among the earliest recollections of my childhood. After my elementary education, I attended high school at Weston but because of the acute shortage of farm labour due to World War II it became necessary for me to leave school and work with my father on the farm

In 1949 I met Alberta at a York County Junior Farmer Dance and on June 3rd, 1949, we were married in Victoria Square United Church. Along about this time my father and I changed from a farming operation to a contracting business consisting of excavating and grading and selling top soil and sand fill off the farm to the fast approaching city of Metropolitan Toronto.

You know that old saying, "You can take the boy from the farm, but you can't take the farm from the boy". Well, I believe it, because something inside was urging me to go back to the farm. The year 1959 brought several startling developments. Firstly, we sold most of our land for a housing subdivision. In February my father passed away, but in April our luck changed and God granted us a son, John. At this point I could no longer resist the pull back to the farm, and in May we purchased 150 acres of good productive land in Simcoe Count just 30 miles north of Toronto.

Our first task was to do extensive remodeling of the barns and establish our Registered Holstein Dairy Herd. We acquired a liquid market for the milk and grew most of the feed for the 80 milking cows and 50 heifers on the farm. However, early in 1967 for various reasons we decided to disperse our herd and last November sold all of our dairy cows.

For some time prior to the sale, Alberta and I had been keenly interested in Charolais cattle and had sent inquiries to the C.C.A. office as well as talking to other Charolais breeders in Ontario.

We both attended the Charrouse sale with the idea of purchasing quality seed stock from both the

Charrouse and SanDan herds. Along these lines we were greatly encouraged by Hays Walker III and Rodney James. Just recently we have added four more top notch females purchased at the Regina Royal Sale. Our goal is to have a good herd of quality Purebred Charolais cattle and our future plans include adding more French influence when possible

In the June 1965 Charolais Newsletter Vern wrote: I was raised on a farm just North of Estevan and was operating a dairy farm prior to moving into Estevan in 1949. The same year I married the former Lyla Snider and was employed by a plumbing and heating firm. I became a journeyman in this trade and was employed by the same firm until 1957 when I went with Simpson Sears where I became a Department Manager.

With always being a livestock lover, it was hard to get cattle out of my mind and in 1960 we purchased approx. 20 head of commercial Herefords, a Hereford-Charolais cross female and half interest in a percentage Charolais bull. Charolais Banner March 1983 - Until the late 1960's, Flat Valley Farm was strictly a commercial cow/calf to feedlot operation finishing about 400 steers a year, most coming from Ehret's Hereford base cow herd. In 1968 Ehret bought a Charolais bull from Reg Phaff to use in the Flat Valley commercial herd. They found the Char-cross steer was working really well. They were getting better gains with the Char-cross and they were selling better on the rail. The first 15 purebred Charolais females arrived at Flat Valley in 1974. Here I grew up and remained until the Dirty Thirties, working on different farms in the Hamiota District. I returned home in 1937 when my father died, and I started farming in the Lyleton District in 1938, in which area I am still located.

In 1944 I married Ellen Leach who was born and educated in Lyleton. We have four children: Arlyn is farming with me and living at home; our two daughters, Shirley and Elna, are attending Melita Collegiate; and our younger son, Dave is taking his grade eight in Lyleton Elementary School.

We are mixed farmers, having both grain and stock. We operate 3 3/4 sections of land, with seventeen hundred acres under cultivation, the balance in pasture and hay. We run a commercial herd of one hundred head of Char-Cross which range from 1/2 to 7/8. I originally had Shorthorn and disposed of the last of them and the 3/8 cows in the fall. In 1958 I saw Clare Gedde's advertisement with Char-Cross bulls for sale. I phoned him and made arrangements to go down and see these animals he had imported from Texas. I was impressed with these big white cattle

and purchased my first bull, a 3/4 Charolais, 1/4 Brahman from Clare that fall. In June of 1959 I imported three bred cows from McGinness Brothers.

He started in 1949 with purebred polled Herefords but soon realized they didn't have the size and quality the horned cattle had. His idea then was to outcross within the breed and found a bull weighing 2700 lbs. with many of the traits he needed. To his dismay however, some of his offspring had scurs, so this bull was replaced with another which turned out strongly polled. By selecting for size and rate of gain even during a period when it wasn't popular, he developed a Hereford herd which in later years became known as having the most size and scale in Canada. It was really natural then for Gene to look at Charolais. He was impressed with their performance and in 1966 he sold the Hereford herd and went Charolais, again selecting for the same traits he'd built his Hereford reputation on.

Charolais Banner April 1973 - Lucien and Myrt were both journeyman bookbinders working in Toronto and in the fall of 1955 got the idea to buy some land near Barrie and commute to work. The roads were poor and during spring breakup Lucien found it impossible to get to work for several days. In those few days they got working at home and became so enthusiastic that they decided to give it a try for at least two years and stay if they liked it or move away if they didn't.

Myrt says, "I still wasn't sold on the idea after two years but we're still here." We had to have cows and pigs because we figured no farm was complete without cows and pigs.....In one way our inexperience was an asset ...We figured there was nothing prettier than a field of red white face cows on a green pasture so we bought some Hereford heifers. Our A.I technician said, "Say, you're French, we've got this new French breed.".....so we tied them. We didn't like the calves, other people said they were off color, so we didn't use Charolais the next year. As those first Charolais calves grew to yearlings alongside some straight-breds we saw the difference in growth and that meant something to us and that sold us on Charolais. Although we first tried Charolais in 1956, the first calves we recorded were born in 1960. By 1963 we were totally involved in grading up.

Charolais Banner Jan. 1967 - It has been a long way from the windswept shores of Nova Scotia with its fishing lines and lobster traps to the grassy slopes of the Prairie, where my family came in April 1904; landing in Maple Creek, Assinibois (now Saskatchewan). There were seven children in the family, five boys and two girls, I being the youngest. The family started ranching on the south side of the Cypress Hills that same summer, with 25 cows of all colors and a bull part Highland.

In the space of 41 years the ranch grew into one of the largest ranches in Canada, spreading into Alberta, until it was sold in 1945. Someone asked me the other day how we managed to keep on the increase and I said it was just like Topsy who just grew.

Over the first ten years we bought cattle of every color and shape, a lot coming from Manitoba, and until 1914 we used grade bulls of various colors. In the fall of that year we bought in a carload of purebred Hereford bulls from Illinois: I think the first full carload to be brought into that part of the country. We used registered bulls until the ranches were sold, our cattle going up in quality until about 1926. Then with the best bulls we could afford, the average weight of the steers seemed a little less each year.

When Gilchrist Brothers Ranches were sold in 1945 I bought back the Deer Creek Ranch and started out again with fairly good cattle, and registered Hereford bulls. From a high of 800 pounds on the average for a few years, the weights of yearling steers in the fall have dropped back to about 760 pounds, repeating the earlier findings, or trend.

In 1957 my brother Rube brought up some Charolais 7/8 bulls from Frank Campbell in Arizona and as all the Rube's neighbors were giving him such a bad time over these "white Holsteins" he almost gave me a couple to try. The first few days I was tempted to take them to the packing house to see if they really had all this red meat they talked about, but my wife wouldn't let me!

She said Rube would be offended and we could put them in a back pasture where they couldn't do our herd any harm quality-wise.

But today our thinking has changed a lot about Charolais. We have found that with the Charolais crossed on any of the British beef breeds we get 70-100 pounds more growth on our yearling steers at market time.

I am not saying what kind of cattle the other fellow should have, but Charolais have been good to us. The cattle industry needs all the beef breeds if it is to get the best out of crossbreeding. Our ranch is now an all-out supporter of these white, easy to handle, aggressive cattle, and is operated by our son Tom, who is equally enthusiastic. Our cross breeding is a three way program, with Black Angus, Hereford and Charolais.

 Charolais Banner June/July 1967 - In February 1949, I had the privilege of spending a day with Fred Turner at his ranch at Weslace, Texas. Here I had my first opportunity to see Charolais cattle and hear of their merits from the man who made the first Charolais importations of the breed from Mexico to the US. Fred Turner was one of the most enthusiastic salesmen I have ever had the pleasure of meeting. His enthusiasm for Charolais cattle ran parallel to his enthusiasm for Ford products - he was the top Ford salesman in the US for several years. In the course of this fascinating visit with Fred Turner, I learned a lot about Charolais cattle and the people in Mexico and the US who were raising them. At that time I am sure he knew most of the breeders as well as the pedigrees of the individual cattle they were raising. I had a camera with me and took colored pictures of a number of the good Charolais bulls and cows that were then jointly owned by Fred Turner and Harl Thomas of Raymodville, Texas. These colored slides were used frequently in the ensuing years to help describe the characteristics of Charolais cattle in discussions with many groups of livestock producers in Western Canada. Among the people that Fred Turner talked about was an individual by the name of Frank Campbell who then ranched at Ash Fork, Arizona. I decided that Frank Campbell was a

Charolais breeder that I would like to meet and scheduled my travels in the direction of Ash Fork. Upon arrival at the ranch I missed Frank and his wife Floye, who were away in Mexico on Charolais business. However, I had the good fortune to meet their three sons - Hugh, Bob and Bill. The boys took me in tow and showed me the results obtained by mixing Charolais blood with a herd of several thousand good commercial Herefords under rugged range conditions. I was impressed with the cattle and the family involved with them. What I saw convinced me that Charolais cattle had a place in Canada. Frequent visits with all the members of the Campbell family during the past 18 years have confirmed this viewpoint and produced one of the finest friendships that my wife Ruth and I have enjoyed in a lifetime of association with livestock people. Since 1955 Frank Campbell has made many Charolais cattle available to Canadian cattlemen and has made numerous visits to Canada to encourage commercial and purebred Charolais breeders.

A milestone in Canadian Charolais history that I recall was a meeting in my office at Lethbridge, in the summer of 1958 with Wayne Malmberg, his brother Max, whose tragic death occurred recently, and John Ballachey of Calgary. Plans were then made for the organization meeting of the Canadian Charolais Association which was held in Calgary in January, 1959. The growth and development of the Association since that time has been phenomenal and is a tribute to enthusiastic and energetic membership.

It is my hope that Charolais breeders will maintain the profitable factors inherent in the breed - size, rapid growth, length of body, rugged bone and scale, minimum fat cover, large eye of lean, good carcass cut-out and adaptability to Canadian conditions. I would be unfortunate if the show ring encourages over-fat, thick, compact cattle in the breed. Performance and progeny testing are valuable tools for the Charolais breeder, and they should be used to maintain and improve individual herds.

Charolais Banner April 1968 - I was born on the farm, not too far from our present site and after “finishing” school which didn’t take too many years during the 30’s, I worked on my father’s farm joining in on the baseball, curling and general activities of that time.

In 1947 I took some time to travel to California and then to Vancouver where I worked in a logging camp until the end of the season.

The year of 1951, I married Jean who was nursing at Redvers, and we spent the winter in BC where we both worked. After returning home we moved to Fairlight, SK where I had a garage and Massey-Harris dealership - my first lesson in buying, selling and finance. I leased the garage in 1955 and we moved to Revers.

In 1956 I purchased a cat and did oil-field work and general construction. In 1958 I rented 1,100 acres from Arm River Farms and three years later acquired another 640 acres. This, along with my own land gave us sizeable acres with the bulk of it being pasture land; I could see it was time to get into the cattle business. By this time the construction business had grown considerably so it wasn’t until 1964 that the opportunity arose. A friend of mine was selling out and moving North and I had a chance to purchase his entire herd of sixty Hereford cows, all descendants of the original Arm River Herd.

The question now was, “What do we use for a herd sire”? Wanting more size I went to Wilf Edgars Fall sale at Innisfail, AB, where I purchased two young Hereford bulls. They didn’t develop the way I thought they should so it was at this time I started gathering information on Charolais. I had read articles on them before and kept mentioning to Jean that Charolais would sure be an opportunity for someone. I decided at this point to get a purebred bull so I wrote to Rodney to get a list of some of the top breeders in the US. On receiving the information we started south, looking at different herds, and at Litton Charolais Ranch decided on our herd sire. This of course was just the start of the “fever” and led to the purchase of a number of females. My favorite quote:’ It’s not how big they get, it’s how fast they get big.”

In the June 1964 Charolais Newsletter Rodney wrote: I was born and raised on a farm at Ponoka, AB. When 19 I took over the home farm and a year later Pearl and I were married. We

farmed there for four years, at which time Pearl had a re-occurrence of TB and went to the Sanatorium in Edmonton. We sold out our equipment, some cattle and put the rest of our Herefords out on shares.

I commenced work as a technician with the Lacombe Artificial Breeding Assn. and moved in with my mother at Ponoka. She and Pearl's mother shared the duties of taking care of Bob and our recent addition, Lorna.

It was during this period, after reading articles in the Canadian Cattlemen, Family Herald and US magazines, I had become interested in Charolais. We visited the Fletcher Bennetts, the late Ray Branum, Ed Lyon and Bud Tull, who all had recently imported Charolais and Charolais-cross from the US.

In the Spring of 1958, Pearl seemed to be well on the mend and town living had just about got the better of me, so we purchased the home quarter and moved to the Lacombe district. I now had my Herefords back home, so decided to cross them with Charolais using AI. The following spring, seeing my cross-calves, I was more enthused than ever. While discussing Charolais at the Ponoka Auction Mart with a farmer neighbour, the man in front overheard our conversation. On introducing himself as Orvil Rawe from Strome, he informed me that his brother, Jim Rawe, was presently in Arizona buying a carload of Charolais. He gave me the hotel that Jim was staying in, so I phoned Jim and placed an order for two 7/8 and one 3/4 heifers. The 3/4 turned out to be a non-breeder, so my money was refunded. The two 7/8 both had heifers that spring and I was in the Charolais business.

We attended the organizational meeting of the CCA on Jan. 17, 1959 in Calgary, even though we didn't actually have any Charolais. We attended the first Annual Meeting in 1960 and at the 1961 Annual Meeting I was elected to the Board of Directors. In 1962, at the meeting held in Lethbridge, I was elected Secretary-Treasurer.

The CCA office was at Maple Creek, SK with Marjorie E.F. Paton ably carrying on the duties of Recording Secretary on a part time basis. A year later, it appeared that the CCA had grown to where it was now a full time job. The Board felt that perhaps better continuity could be attained by combining the duties of Recording-Secretary and Secretary-Treasurer into one full time position. I was offered the opportunity of taking over these combined offices and after a long sleepless night we reached a decision: I accepted this offer and resigned from the Lacombe Artificial Breeding Assn., where I had been employed for over 6 years. On March 1, 1963 the CCA office was moved to our home at Lacombe with Marjorie Paton remaining on until April 1st, teaching me the various office techniques.

In 1938, I married Marguerite Beaulieu and our home has been blessed with three girls, and of late, we have added to the family two fine sons-in-laws, one who now own some horses and two Charolais cross cows.

We started crossing Charolais on our Herefords and Shorthorns in 1957. While we only have a small herds specializing only in top quality breeding stock, we now have four 3/4 Charolais and one French Charolais heifer on our farm and another French heifer presently in quarantine. We also have some 60 horses specializing in Appaloosa and American Saddle Bred horses.

Since we started cross-breeding Charolais, we have always sold our cross-bred Charolais bulls for good prices to farmers wishing to crossbreed on a commercial herd to increase the size of their calves and also the rate of growth of their calf crop. We have had a lot of repeat orders because when a farmer tries Charolais he usually stays with it. In fact, now we have a big demand for Charolais cross-bred females.

We firmly believe that the commercial beef breeder and commercial feeder of the future will want to cross-breed with Charolais to get extra vigor, extra size and faster rate of gain. The poultryman and the grain corn grower have long ago recognized the value of cross breeding for the extra vigor. It is hard to believe, but some hybrid corn varieties often yield more per acre than either of the parent stock used in cross breeding. Of more recent years, the hog men have recognized the real value of cross breeding.

Our farm is within the city limits of Brockville. I have been manager of the Brookville Co-operative Assn. for 21 years, and have also been active in many organizations such as Past President of the Canadian Landrace Assn, the Co-op Union of Ontario, the Brockville Rotary Club, the Vincent de Paul Hospital Board in Brockville. At the present time I am Chairman of the Brockville Separate School Board, Vice President of the Brockville Memorial Centre Board, Vice-President of the Rotary Pool Board, Director of Leeds Co-op Medical Services, of the 4H Beef and Poultry Club in the Country for several years, a Director and on the executive of the Co-op Fire and Casualty Company, all with the Head Office in Regina, SK. As a director of the Co-op Insurance Companies I have travelled to every province of Canada, except Newfoundland. In my travel I like to visit Co-ops especially farm oriented ones and I also try to visit Charolais breeders whenever possible in other areas.

I am very busy but enjoy my work and hobbies, and especially my home and farm. We travel some with our house trailer on weekends.

After giving you some of my activities is it any wonder my wife Marguerite sometimes says, "Why don't you stay home and rest a little?"

The farm wasn't as big in those days of course, but in addition to the farming he always had cattle - Shorthorn. Now we farm four and one half sections and run more cattle.

In 1939 the P.F.R.A. took over land to make community pastures to help farmers raise more cattle. Dad put his herd in with the others. The bulls used were Herefords. From this cross we kept the females from the best producing cows.

In the early 1950's we were getting an American magazine, "The Farm Quarterly" and it was in here that we first learned of the great white cattle. At that time their rate of gain was hard to believe, so we wrote for information and prices....however were disappointed when none arrived. While visiting friends in Alberta we again heard of the Charolais. There was a herd close by so we visited the rancher and bought a bull from the late Ray Branum. It was a 3/4 and as we were living in a purebred area, we never got him home (Mr. Branum returned our money), however it was a second disappointment.

In 1958 while attending a friend's wedding at Fort Macleod, we heard of Mr. Fletcher Bennet's herd. This time we bought a purebred bull - Etienne J B 2, MC21. He was bred by Judd Bridge Farms, New Milford, Conn., and this put us in the Charolais business. Up to this year we had bought only one domestic female. We have bought bulls and bred A.I.

Charolais Newsletter June 1966 - Enola Laveck wrote: Bud Laveck was born in Crossfield, AB and spent the first 9 years of his life in Water Valley. He finished his schooling in Airdrie, where he worked with his stepfather, John Fletcher, on his farm. Several years of 4H Club work stimulated Bud's interest in cattle.

After our marriage in 1951, we took a temporary job with Don McKinnon at Carsland, while he went on a trip to Phoenix. When spring seeding came, we took a prearranged job with Ed McKinnon at Airdrie and Bud was able to continue his 4H work.

Upon leaving Ed's ranch in 1953 we went to work for Victor Watson on his Willow Springs Ranch at Airdrie. Bud spent 8 of the 16 months we were at the ranch in a leg cast when his knee went into a forage harvester. However, it was due to Mr. Watson putting Bud in charge as manager here on his Sarcee Agricultural Lease, that gave us the chance to have some stock of our own. Brushing, breaking and farming many acres and pasturing many more, Mr. Watson allowed us to keep a limited number of cows as part of our wages.

Bud's interest in the "Silver Cattle with the Golden Future" had been growing for some time and he decided he wanted to try some cross breeding. He visited several people raising Charolais, one of the first being Ed Lyons. An ad in the Cattlemen took us to Pincher Creek and Fletcher Bennets, where we bought our first Charolais Bull Etienn JB, affectionally called "Tiny" by the family. This was in late August of 1959. We were too late for breeding that year but put him with some big purebred Herefords anyway.

The spring of 1959 brought 11 crossbred calves and even though they were later than the other calves, at weaning time they were as heavy as the other calves and considerably heavier than some.

In July 1959 Bud made a trip to Strome and purchased five femals from the AAA Ranch. Several trips to Ray Branum's Ranch at Craigmyle convinced us that the Charolais-cross was the one to have. We have since bought a purebred bull from Shirley Branum and are very pleased with him.

We have sold some Charolais, but mostly we have exchanged cross bred cows for our original stock until we have only a few without some Charolais cross in them. We have a few registered Angus cows that delight us each year by weaning a Charolais-Angus cross calf almost as big as the cows themselves. This is Bud's choice of cross, but he likes them all.

Bud took his better bred Charolais to his stepfather in Airdrie and they formed a partnership, Fletcher and Laveck. They use mostly A.I. and are pleased with the results. Bud's young brother, Wayne takes care of the records for them

In the October 1965 Charolais Newsletter Ed Lyons wrote: I born and grew up on a farm twenty miles east of Calgary in the Strathmore, Cheadle district. In the dirty thirties when a good cow was worth only twelve or fifteen dollars, I decided there was no future in farming so I went to work in the Turner Valley oilfield. While with this oil company, we drilled at the Kinsella gas fields where I met my wife, Millie, who was working at Viking. Millie was born in Consort and spent her early years on her parents' farm. After working six years in the oil fields, we bought the service station where we now live.
Most of my customers being mixed farmers, I became involved in the cattle business. My uncle, a Charolais breeder in Louisiana, questioned how a Charolais would winter in Canada. Visiting us in 1955, and finding we had ample pasture, he inquired if we would be interested in this breed of cattle. Arrangements were made and in 1956 a shipment of 30 heifers and one bull arrived.

In that year we had people from all across Canada visit our herd, many wishing to purchase, some left orders to be filled. The next year I flew down to H.M. Kimball's ranch in Louisiana who has an interest in a Charolais Co. in Mexico. From him I purchased a cattle liner load to fill a part of the demand.

Having a family of four boys, I instigated the forming of a 4-H Beef Club. Different years we showed Charolais-crosses at our show and sale. We are particularly proud of a Charolais-Angus cross Terry showed four years ago at the Calgary baby beef show and sale. This calf at sixteen months weighed 1430 pounds.

In the April 1966 Charolais Newsletter Max Malberg wrote: Eleven years ago my wife, Ardath and I went to Wellington, Colorado to buy a 3/4 Charolais bull from Clint Ferris. This bull was so homely we nearly left him there. However, he had the scale, volume and general get-up-and-go so lacking in the Herefords back home that we decided to take him. We christened him Pandit Pierre. Pandit for his Indian ancestry and Pierre for his French. What he lacked in good looks, he made up in personality. I believe Pandit was the third bull of Charolais blood to enter Canada.

He was a terrific breeder and left scale and general do-ability in every calf that he sired. His first calf crop came in 1956 consisting of forty-three head of calves. The top ten of this group had the top ten of some two hundred Herefords of my dad's and brother's Gordon, Orville and Evan, beaten by 93 pound per calf and that sent them scurrying to Colorado for a truck load of Charolais bulls in October 1957.

I sold the first Charolais-cross steers in Canada. Ian Davidson of Calgary Packers bought these on a rail grade basis. They graded nine red label and one blue label, all exceptionally fine carcasses. He remarked that they might not look so good on the hoof, but that on the hook they are beauties.

I sold one of Pandit's daughters of '56 just before Christmas. She weighed 1440 pounds and sold for \$13.80, a total of \$198.72. The same day I sold a '56 Hereford and she was as good as they come. She weighed 1220 and brought \$12.80 for a total of \$156.15. Both of these cows had lost their calves in the spring and were sold off grass and snow. Old Pandit made me \$42.56 more that day and I guess that is the story of his life. We sold him in the fall of '64 out of the breeding pasture at 2300 pounds. The family didn't dare eat baloney for months.

In the Spring of 1958, I bought a purebred bull from Clint Ferris that I bred to Pandit Pierre's daughters. Mr. Fletcher Bennett of Pincher Creek, brought in a car load of bulls from the Judd Bridge Farms in Connecticut, US. These bulls arrived and I beat my brothers there for the first choice, and got that great bull Bevon Jr. His daughters not only look good, they are good. I believe Bevon has made quite a contribution to the Charolais industry in Canada. But enough bull about my bulls.

The Charolais cattle have been good to me. I am proud I had a part to play in the formation of the Charolais Association. It is gratifying now to see that the policy of registering A.I. sired calves, that some of us argued so strongly to support, has proven to be the tool of advantage that we thought it would.

I believe that the next goal of this association should be to bring about a change in the ridiculous system of grading carcasses so the producer of superior meat carcasses will be rewarded for such.

In the May 1965 Charolais Newsletter Wayne Malmberg wrote: We brought the first Charolais cattle in April, 1955, a recorded 7/8 bull and a 3/4 cow. We were also the first to

market Charolais crossbred cattle. The press gave a great deal of publicity to this new breed and we were cussed and discussed in many parts of Canada.

I suppose pioneering came naturally to me. Around 1859 my great grandfather crossed the Atlantic Ocean from Sweden to New York in a sailboat. From New York he proceeded with his family to Independence, Missouri. He crossed the plains to Utah with an ox team. My grandfather, who was four at the time, often recalled in his stories how the train was divided at the Platt River by a herd of buffalo, so numerous that they took five hours to pass.

The family farmed in Utah with oxen and built up a sheep herd, which they trailed to Oregon in the 1890's. The sheep were traded for horses, which the family trailed through Washington and British Columbia to High River, AB in 1904.

Mother and Dad homesteaded 24 miles east of there, where the town of Herronton, AB now stands. I was born there in 1906, the second child of seven children; two girls and five boys. I attended a country school, and high school at High River. The school of "Hard Knocks" in the dirty '30's completed my education.

In 1918 my Dad purchased a large ranch at Spring Coulee 35 miles southwest of Lethbridge. This ranch was run as a company until it was paid for in 1945. At that time the ranch was equally divided between Dad and the five boys.

Georgia and I were married in 1948. Ours is a mixed family: mine, hers and ours. They are: my daughter Leah; Georgia's children Arlene, Dale and Gary; our 13 year old daughter Mavis; and seven grandchildren.

I have tried raising almost everything that would make or lose money: wheat, oats, barley, flax, horses, pigs, chickens, sheep and cattle. I have sold good steers for a low as \$3.00 per hundred to as high as \$33. Georgia and I have an agreement that if we ever sell steers that high again I will buy her a pink Cadillac.

In 1953 I became interested in Charolais cattle. We visited the ranches of Fred Turner and Arl Thomas in Texas, and Clint Ferris in Wyoming. It was at this time I was invited to become a Founder Member of the Certified Improved Charolais Association, which later became known as the Pan American Charolais Association. The other founder members are Clint Ferris, Bill Sidley, Joe Hewitt, Cliff Aultman and Buddy Cobb.

The conflict between the various Charolais Associations in the United States made me realize the need for an organization to record Charolais cattle in Canada.

In the fall of 1958 Ray Branum, John Ballachey, Harry Hargrave, Max Malmberg, Fletcher Bennett and I met in Lethbridge, to discuss the formation of a Canadian Association. This group extended invitations to all Canadians interested in breeding Charolais cattle to attend a meeting to be held in the Palliser Hotel in Calgary on January 17, 1959. This meeting resulted in the formation of the Canadian Charolais Association, with Ray Branum as its first President.

Charolais Banner Feb. 1977 - In 1955 he bought a 15,000 acre ranch in the east end of the Island of Molokai in Hawaii and set about stocking it with cattle. Having seen and heard about Charolais in his extensive travels, he brought over both Charolais and Charbray bulls and heifers. Like many early Charolais breeders, he found his way to the Litton Ranch and there bought nine bulls - all sons of Sam 951.

Coupled to the production problem was finding a market for the beef. In Hawaii most of the beef market was controlled by the big Parker Ranch with only one packing plant on the Islands. The herd on Molokai had by that time grown to 2500 and Murphy had to find a market for them. In 1966 three ranches were bought at Grove, Oklahoma and 1250 cows and calves were selected to be shipped from Molokai to San Francisco and then on to the ranches at Grove.

All this took place during a time when exciting and significant events were happening in Canada. The importation program had been established and Fullblood Charolais were being imported direct from France.

Murphy established a base in Canada with the purchase of four farms and set about building a Full French herd - G M Charolais

Then we met Harry Hargrave for the first time in 1957 and he again re-aroused our interest in Charolais cattle. My wife and I then decided to take my parents (who were in partnership with us in the cattle business at that time) on a tour of the top U.S. Charolais breeders. Ray arrived only a few hours before we reached the Lucky 7 Ranch at McDermitt, Nevada, with his cattle liner rented to take back a mixed load of cows and bulls to his ranch
In the spring of 1958 we brought back two loads of Charolais cows, heifers and bulls also from the Lucky 7 Ranch. They had been shipped there from the Ashfork Livestock Company. These were our first Charolais stock. Since then our enthusiasm has grown year by year. We have been breeding up a Charolais herd and also crossing our Angus cows with Charolais until today we have a herd of purebred and recorded Charolais numbering 173.

Soon after graduation in 1941, they formed St. Croix Poultry farms, raising laying hens and selling eggs to the Halifax market for the next 40 years. Through A.I., using some King John semen in the early sixties and later Rainbow Sampson semen, they recognized the value of the Charolais breed and soon began to converse with breeders in Western Canada. They applied for permits for the first importation of Charolais from France but were unsuccessful that year, but were notified that they would be on the list for the B/1966 importation.

Charolais Banner Jan. 1973 - Ted Perrin, Pete Perrin's nephew, who is in charge of the Charolais herd says "I guess you'd say we've been crossbreeding ever since we started." Pete was with the Matador Community Pasture in 1930 when the U. of S. in Saskatoon ran the first scientific crossbreeding project. They used four different breeds of cows and would use one breed of bulls for two years, then switch and use another breed for two years. This way they had one set of straight bred and three crossbred sets of calves each year.

When Pete bought the West Ranch the cows were mainly Herefords and in 1943 he started crossbreeding with Hereford and Angus bulls. In the late 40's he tried Shorthorn bulls, but this cross couldn't stand the severe winters so he dropped them. In the early 50's he tried one Brahman bull but dropped him because he didn't throw true to type, the cows milked so heavy that they came in skinny in the fall and couldn't stand the cold winter.

In 1963 when I was Foreman on the Matador, I took an A.I. course and in 1964 I came with Pete on this ranch. We'd read and talked about Charolais for a long time and in 1966 we got a freezer and bred 35 cows to Charolais bulls.

We'd heard stories how Charolais wouldn't rustle with the British breeds. This may or may not have been true with the early Brahman crosses, but we sure didn't find that with ours. Our Char-cross cows ranged the furthest on the winter grazing pastures and were the last to come back to the buildings in the winter.

In the March 1966 Charolais Newsletter Mary R. Richardt wrote: When Otto W. Richardt of Belle Vue Dairy Farm, southeast of Saskatoon, brought the first Charolais to the Saskatoon area in August 1958, it was not unusual - for he has specialized in "pioneering firsts" all his life. Mr. Richardt saw the giant white super-beef cattle at a fair in Texas when he and Mrs. Richardt were holidaying in the southern USA. The breed not only fascinated him but their potential so intrigued him that he made immediate arrangements to import several head for his own farm. Mr. Richardt came to Saskatoon from Wisconsin in 1909, bringing with him six Holstein heifers, the first of that breed to come into this part of Saskatchewan. Later, he augmented his herd by bringing in the first Guernseys to this area. His Holsteins and Guernseys took many first prizes at the Saskatoon Exhibition in the mid-1920.

After holidaying in Wisconsin in 1956, where he visited A.I. units in Watertown and Waupun, he brought the intimate knowledge and enthusiasm which resulted in the formation of the Saskatoon A.I. Co-Op, the first in the province and which continues as the largest in Saskatchewan. At that time, the farmers said, "if Otto is pushing this, it will be a success", and it is.

His interests have not been limited to the production level but included active work in organizing the Saskatoon Dairy Pool, on whose Board of Directors he served for ten years.

Recognizing the importance and necessity of keeping adequate records if production of quality milk in quantity is to be advanced, Mr. Richardt organized the Saskatoon Herd Improvement Association in the late 1920's, served as one of the early presidents and was on its executive board for many years. In 1957, Mr. Richardt's herd won the Star Phoenix Trophy for the greatest increase in milk and butterfat production in one year in the province.

To provide adequate feed for his substantial dairy herd, Mr. Richardt experimented with growing fodder corn and in 1921 produced the first such crop in this area. However, the cool prairie nights were not conducive to the development of the corn and in 1924 he grew the first sunflowers in quantity to fill his concrete upright silo, also a first in the district. His was also the first to use a windmill for pumping water and the first in this district to have White Plymouth Rocks - they took many firsts at the Saskatoon Exhibition.

Prior to coming to Saskatoon, Mr. Richardt did the organizational work for a cheese factory near Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Aside from the dairy business, this man of firsts organized the Homewood School District in 1920 and was its first chairman and continued as chairman for 30 years. He is a charter member of Augustana Lutheran Church, Saskatoon, and has served as deacon and trustee.

Mr. Richardt was on the first Board of Directors of the Canadian Charolais Association. He is still keenly interested in the association, even though physically incapacitated which restricts his activities.

In the Charolais Newsletter May 1954 - John Rudiger wrote: 1959 was a memorable year for the Rudigers, a year that changed our lives socially and economically. Socially - as we have met and made many new friends and attended many gatherings and meetings across Canada, United States and Mexico. Economically - as we never believed that a person could go so far into debt for just a few "white animals". For it was early February of 1959 that we travelled to Texas and purchased our first Charolais herd from the Michaelis Ranch in Kyle, Texas. Our first importation was 8 (15/16 and purebred) heifers and a bull (Santa Claus). They were often referred to as Santa Claus and his eight reindeer. Being one of the pioneers of Charolais in Saskatchewan, people wondered if perhaps we weren't off on a "wild goose chase". Since then we have made three more importations from Texas, and one from B.C., and our Charolais herd has increased to over 100.

Charolais Banner - April 1974 & Nov. 1978 - Wilf Sieger's father came from Texas to homestead north of Halkirk in 1905 and in 1916 moved to the Talbot district where Wilf was born and raised. After spending four years in the Royal Canadian Air Force Motor Transport Division, Wilf returned home, married Doris Bargholz from the neighboring community and through the VLA bought a half section of land six miles south of his father's farm.

Doris' brother, Ken Bargholz, who was living at Kindersley at the time, had been using Charolais semen on his own cows, and Wilf was so impressed with the performance of the crossbred calves that he bought a half-Charolais bull from Ken. They also bought a Charolais bull from Ray Braunum in 1959. The foundation for the Wildor herd was laid in 1966, when direct buying from France became possible.

They have increased their holdings to six and 1/4 sections, with three thousand acres under cultivation. They grow mainly wheat, oats and barley. Until 1974 they fed approximately four hundred steers a year, but since then have decided to go into a straight breeding program.

Charolais Banner April 1971 - Another "young fellow", new in the Charolais business is Denzil Sutton, of Rocanville. Denzil and Wilma have for a reason taken a shine to the polled Charolais (perhaps it's their 23 years with polled Herefords?). When Denzil sold his large Hereford herd, his plans were to purchase only 25 or 30 cows, however, his herd now has 72 females with 52 calving this spring.

Charolais Banner June 1974 - I was born in Peterborough, On near my grandfather's farm where registered Clydesdale horses were raised and sold. Dad worked on the farm in summer and drove lead teams in lumber camps in winter, then rode the logs on river drives each spring down to the mills. In the fall of 1915, Dad came west on a harvester excursion to Sceptre, SK. He liked the country so much that he sold our house in Peterborough, gathered up some good horses and in 1916 we all moved to the Sceptre area. We've always had cattle, first Shorthorn, then

Herefords. In 1937 no crop, no feed, so we sold everything in July but our two year old heifers for \$10.00 per head and I rode cattle cars to Ontario. I worked as apprentice mechanic there until fall of '38 when my father had heart trouble.

Dad had gathered up more cattle to hold our lease, and prices were still low, so after harvest I rented the local butcher shop (that had gone broke) and with no experience we marketed the ranch cattle this way. The shop expanded to handle groceries, and we developed a 74 mile delivery route twice a week to bring fresh meat to two adjoining towns.

In December 1940 I married Wilma Cropp, a pretty Sceptre school teacher. Wilma had been raised on a cattle and grain farm in eastern Saskatchewan not far from our present ranch. She had a thorough knowledge of cattle, having done most of the riding for her father.

Then along came the war, we sold the store and everything but Wilma's piano, made a down payment on a half section farm and rented it to a brother. Each place I was stationed, Wilma was able to get steady employment. Then I went on an all-expense paid trip to Europe including the Aramanches beach head.

Charolais Banner October 1967 - I came to this country, right into the Windermere Valley, as an immigrant from Germany in 1952. At first I worked in mines and logging camps. After a few years, I started a small sawmill with a partner. It was during this time that I married Hedi, who was born in Switzerland.

I had been raised on a farm in the old country and I liked farming very much. So when we sold the sawmill six years later, we were able to buy our farm in 1962.

We took over a herd of commercial Herefords with the farm and after two years we came to the conclusion that either we or the Herefords would have to go..

Our neighbor, Winston Wolfenden, with his immense enthusiasm for Charolais, helped to convince us that this is the coming breed. We were also very impressed by the open A.I. policy of the Canadian Charolais Association and we still feel that this is our best tool for constantly improving the breed.

We bought our first Charolais in 1965 and now have 30 females, mostly purebreds. We still have 30 head of Herefords which we are crossbreeding. Of these calves we have had 7 months weaning weights of 610 lbs.

As a cash crop we grow 12 acres of Foundation Seed potatoes.

I enjoy belonging to the Canadian Charolais Association and have great pleasure in meeting all the pleasant and enthusiastic people at the conventions.

We live in the beautiful Windermere Valley (renamed Charolais Valley) and hope any of you travelling in the district will drop in for a visit.

Charolais Banner March 1968 - I was raised in Calgary, the son of an elementary school principal, but I always had a yen for the farm and for livestock. An opportunity was never passed up to visit and work on my uncles' farms

Eleven years ago I graduated in Engineering from Oklahoma University. Six months later Jackie (a native Oklahoman) and I were married. I have worked in the oil business in Calgary since graduation. Currently I am Production Manager for Amax Petroleum Corp.

About 5 years ago I made my move into the cattle business with my brother Grant and with the advice of Carl Skibsted, a retired Polled Hereford breeder. We bought a small commercial herd. Our search for the right man to look after them led us to the farm of John Wilson of Lacombe. Our relationship with John and his family has been most enjoyable.

My subscription to the Canadian Cattleman took over from my oil magazines. The first articles to catch my eye were those pertaining to performance testing. Then those on cross-breeding as a rapid means of advancement in performance. Then came the articles on Charolais, the breed which was currently contributing the most to improvements in performance in beef cattle, both as a pure breed and in crossbreeding.

The spring of 1966 brought the need for a new bull for our commercial operation. An ad pertaining to the A.C.A. sale at Stettler caught my eye and we went out there and solved the bull problem in a hurry. However, it opened the door and I caught a very bad case of Charolais fever. Before we had any Char-cross calves, I sold John the commercial cows and the bull and went looking for Charolais breeding stock. By the way, the calves proved up the merits of commercial crossbreeding with Charolais bulls and John was my first customer for a commercial Charolais bull from my own breeding herd.

My basic breeding stock was purchased from Ron Rouse, Rodney James, Don Pochylko and Ken Bargholz. Since I was looking for quality regardless of percentage, I ended up with everything from half bloods to 15/16 Charolais cows.

Our program is built around a 6 week A.I. season plus the services of a top pickup bull. My goal right now is a fairly small herd concentrating on the improvement and up-breeding of the basic cow herd. I hope to increase the amount of French influence in the herd with selected bulls as they prove out. I hope to import fullblood French stock also.

Charolais Newsletter Sept. 1965 - Bud Tull wrote: I started out in life and still live about 1 miles from where my Dad homesteaded. He came from Kentucky in 1902 with only a mule horse and a walking plow. My formal education was a bit lengthy, 12 years in school which I never liked, 2 years at Olds Ag College, plus 3 years at U of A.

Since horses have always come before women and cows, we began raising Percherons when I was about 16. We ended up with a fairly good string of bucking horses, so I was a rodeo contractor for a few years, but the rest were sold for about \$10.00 a head. From there we started raising Thoroughbreds and found out that we just had good chuck-wagon horses, so our outfit ran the circuit for 10 years. At present we have Arabians and some Walking Horses.

The cattle business has progressed much the same way - from Hereford to Brangus and then Charolais. In 1940 I had a little argument with some polio bugs and sent 18 month in hospital and darn near lost the fight. My dad passed away in 1945 and left me with a lot of land and twice as many mortgages to pay off. It was either make a go of it or go broke. Very fortunately I had a lot of good help - all except a cook - so I married Irene in 1947.

We were all set up to go but the cattle were not paying and our small well bred heifers gave a lot of trouble reproducing. Our old veterinarian, Dr. Block said to me one day, "Boy, if you intend to make any money with cattle, you're going to have to raise them bigger and longer".

For the next few years I used Brangus bulls and had no luck. The next breed to try was Charolais, so in 1956 I imported a few cows and a bull from Ross Parker at Hagerman, Idaho.

The first calf produced was performance tested at the University of Alberta and did so well I had to promise not to publicize the results. Consequently this was our new breed for the future and we purchased 12 heifers from Earl Thode at Caca Grande, Arizona. At the same time I bought a bull from Herb Hawthorne at Meridian, Texas, which proved to be no good and his replacement even worse. So from then on I used A.I.

I haven't promoted the breed too much because I sell the poorer ones for beef and keep only the top ones for our herd. No doubt we've turned in more papers to the association dead animal file than anyone in Canada. Never the less, Charolais are good profitable cattle no matter how you

sell them. If our breeders continue performance testing and not looking for the fast buck, we will produce bulls with a 5 lb. gain and a 6 lb. conversion on hay. This will continue to make them the most profitable cattle in North America. Please note: I'm a sticker for profit as it's the only cattle fad I have. The head, hide and color don't mean too much to me.

Charolais Banner Oct. 1968 - It was in Holland, the homeland of the Black & White Holsteins that I was born and raised, and it was not on a farm either. My father had a feed business and when I quit school, (much too early I found out later), I went to work at the feed business at home.

However, I was always interested in farming, and also either coming to Canada or the States, and finally Canada won out, when I managed to get enough money for a boat ticket, and landed in Halifax in April 1930, with the idea of being a farmer, so I thought. But the hard work, long

days and low pay made me do some thinking. I decided that more education would not be a bad idea, so next year I enrolled at the Agricultural College in Guelph, and graduated from there in 1936.

But jobs were still not plentiful, and it was not until 1938 that I finally got to work for one of the big Feed and Fertilizer Companies, and was with them for four years. While on the road as a salesman, I found out that there was a feed business for sale in Aylmer, and I decided that I wanted to work for myself so the deal was made in 1942, and I was in business.

Farming still appealed to me, and in 1950 I was offered a farm with everything on it, and it did not take long to make up my mind, so the deal was made and I was a farmer. The cattle on the farm were Holsteins, and it stayed this way until I heard stories about Charolais and the good beef cattle they were. I kept on the lookout for more information and in 1964 I was able to buy four bred cows, and although the price asked for these cows was much more than I had been paying for the Holsteins I had, I bought these Charolais cows, so I could see for myself if they were as good as I was told. This was the beginning and that fall I bought 6 head from a farmer who had up-bred these from some good Shorthorn cows he owned. When, the next spring, Shirley Branum wanted to sell her herd, I went to see it, and bought 29 head from her. It was not too long afterwards that I had more Charolais than Holsteins, and the Holsteins were sold that spring.

The herd has been entered on the Ontario Beef Cattle Performance Testing Program, so I will know what each cow in the herd does. French bulls have been and are being used, and some top domestic females have been added. I am inclined to think that the best Charolais will be developed from crossing our best domestic cattle with the pure French. But should this prove wrong, I hope to have a number of pure French Charolais as well.

Operating a farm and breeding Charolais cattle gives a man unlimited scope to use his brains, and use his energy to do the work. But at the same time I believe the following lines contain a lot of truth, "Man has been given two ends, one to sit with, one to think with. It depends which end you use the most, for head you win, and tails you lose."

Charolais Banner Nov. 1966 - I was born and raised on the farm west of Wetaskiwin, AB, where I have lived all my life. Earlier years were spent mainly at mixed farming, gradually increasing the numbers of beef animals we had, which consisted mainly of Shorthorn and Hereford breeding. I also had a few purebred Herefords, using a registered Hereford bull on the

two breeds. We were reasonably satisfied with the cross-breeds, but when it came to the straight breeds, all I can say is that they were nice to look at, but when it came to gainability, they were tail enders.

It was in 1957 that I met Anne in our fair city of Wetaskiwin our homes were not more than twenty miles apart. We were married in 1958. This was also the year I read a few articles on Charolais that got the ball rolling. We bred two of our cows AI to Charolais and the next spring, after seeing these calves grow for just a few weeks, I was convinced this was it.

Shortly after learning that the late Ray Branum had Charolais in Canada, we paid him a visit. I am proud to say that I learned a ABC's of the Charolais breed from Ray, and purchased two 13/16 yearling heifers before leaving.

We increased our herd by cross breeding and buying females from various herds of the US. Our last ones being from the Litton Charolais Ranch and Bill Lamme of Laclede, Missouri. We imported three heifers from France in 1966 and 1967

Through A.I. we have been able to use some of the best bulls in North America, By way of performance testing and culling, we hope to someday reach the "Hi Standard" for which we have set out goal. I believe there is always room for improvement.

My favorite sport is hunting, Two other fellows and I have hunted some 15 odd years and have been successful every year, although once in a while a moose gets in the way. This fall I will be on a hunt into the wilderness making a try for Caribou. We will be taking two or our horses to ride - we have second and third generation thoroughbreds.

I will say that by visiting fellow Charolais breeders, we have seen some tremendous cattle and made some wonderful friend, people we would never have met had it not been for the Charolais breed.

In the 1964 Charolais Newsletter Winston wrote: I spent all of my early years here in the Columbia Valley on the farm which I later bought from my father. At the age of seventeen I decided that there was bigger money elsewhere to be made, and I went driving team on the

construction of the “Big Bend Highway”. After two years, with still itchy feet, I decided to move on, winding up with the CM & S Co. at Trail, BC where I worked for nearly four years. War broke out and I was away again. I joined the Air Force which kept me occupied for five years, and while stationed at Dafoe, SK I met Val, a Saskatchewan school teacher, and we were married in 1944. In the spring of 1946 I was discharged and returned to the farm at home which now looked greener than any far pasture.

One big setback came in November 1959 when we lost our home by fire, a home which we had worked so hard to build. The bright side of this misfortune was in finding out what wonderful friend and neighbors we had.

Our first enterprise on the farm was to build a herd of registered Herefords. This was followed by a change-over to the dairy business and a herd of registered Ayreshires on ROP test.

It was about this time that I started gathering literature and talking about these white cattle from France. I think Val was beginning to wonder if our next move was to be to France or Mexico, for I now knew for sure that I would like to try the Charolais cattle and so I placed on order with Ed Lyons. He brought us three heifers and a bull from Louisiana. To us this seemed like quite a gamble at the time, but a gamble that we have never regretted. Our first calf crop came from a Charolais bull on our Hereford-Shorthorn cross cows. Of course, we heard many remarks from the neighbours about the color of these calves and it was not until fall when the time to market these big calves came, that people began to realize that, perhaps, we had something. The first two years’ calf crops went to Calgary with an average weight of over 600 pounds at weaning time. These weights were so attractive that there was soon a good demand for my bulls.

In 1963 I purchased a purebred herd sire from Rodney James. In the fall of 1964 we purchased a few cows from Shirley Branum.
