I met Marg at the Wainwright Stampede in June 1960. At that time she was my girlfriend's girlfriend. Well!!

I purchased the home place from my father in September 1960 and at this time my brother George moved to his present location. I spent the winter buying Holstein calves in the Fraser Valley, keeping an eye on my cattle and horses at home, and in between doing this, I was courting Marg. We were married in Medicine Hat in June 1961 (the temperature was 103 degrees on our wedding day) and settled on the home place. In the fall of 1962, Roy moved to his present location and in the spring of 1963 my parents moved into their new home in Marsden. Marg and I have been to France for the past three summers, selecting cattle for importation. I endeavor to take in as many of the Charolais activities and meetings as possible. I am an active life member of the American International Association and Performance Registry International, plus an active member of the Canadian Charolais Association and the Saskatchewan Charolais Association.

Charolais are my living; but my family is my life. We have many happy hours together, singing, hunting, riding, tenting and when it comes to hauling bales, it's a family affair.

In the Oct./Nov. 1964 Charolais Newsletter Roy Biensch wrote: I was raised on a farm at Artland, SK where I resided until 1962 when we moved not far to our present site "Rainbow Ranch". Until this time I was in partnership with my father & three brothers. In my younger years I spent much of my time taking part in sports - baseball, hockey & hunting. In 1954 Joan and I took the big step of matrimony and since then have been blessed with three health children. After reading many articles in U.S. magazines, we decided in 1958 to go on a tour in Canada and the U.S. to see some Charolais herds. Following this we purchased a purebred bull at Pincher Creek, and later on that fall, went to Idaho and purchased five head of percentage females. Two of these were to have calves to register in the spring, so we joined the AICA. On January 16, 1959 we received a letter from John Ballachey, that there was to be an organizational meeting in Calgary on January 17 to form a Canadian Association which was good news. There was a mix-up in the address so that we received the letter the night before the meeting. So we were on our way in the wee hours the next morning. It was very encouraging to meet so many people all enthused about the same thing, Charolais. It was a successful day indeed.

In 1961 we purchased a portable scale and have kept our own records of our cattle the first two years. In 1963 we enrolled our entire herd in P.R.I. and have found that I refer to these records frequently in selecting new animals for my breeding herd. I believe that the Charolais are a high performing breed and that we should select with performance records to keep their standards high.

Francie Borgal passed away March 3, 1982

In the Sept. 1966 Charolais Newsletter Frances Borgal wrote: Ev and Francie Borgal here, at Pridalta Stock Farm. Ev would like to call it Pridalta Charolais Ranch, but having lived in these parts all my life I know that ranches are places where people live and don't do too much work and such is not the case here. Ev was a high school teacher at the Lethbridge Collegiate for 13 years and in the Air Force for 5 years and I, a registered nurse and radiographer for 20 odd years. After coming to Priddis in 1957 Ev spent about five years tearing up willow roots with a caterpillar and me picking them up and burning them, so it is no wonder I have that smoke tanned look.

In the spring of 1959 we bought four head of Charbray heifers from Mr.Keith Matz, Holtville, California and that same winter we bought a purebred bull calf from him, the dam of the calf being one that Mr. Metz had sold to Fletcher Bennet of Pincher Creek. He was taking the cow back to Holtville and we were able to talk him into leaving the calf here at Pridalta. He, the bull, proved a very good investment as the first crop of calves we had out of him averaged 90 lbs. each over the straight bred Hereford we had at the time. We then bought 30 head of Angus cows and 20 head of Shorthorns and after using the Charolais bull on all three breeds decided that we liked the Charolais Angus cross the best and have since eliminated the other two breeds.

Before I forget, I must tell you about the first reaction in our neighborhood, which by the way boast some real top breeders of all the other beef breed, including Galloway and Santa Gertudis, to our Charbray Heifers. We have a Welsh neighbour with a very pronounce Gaelic accent and who speaks very slowly. He passed our place the day after our heifers arrived from California and the following is his remark; "In the name of heavens, what have the Borgal's got down there ??? CAAAMELS", (pronounce like that but spelled Camels).

I caught my first Charolais bug on a visit to France in 1956 and it is quite infectious because Ev has caught it too and after his first visit to the American Royal in Kansas City, he is a bigger booster of Charolais than I will ever be.

We run a herd of about 100 cows which we hope will eventually all be Charolais, in a valley known as Oatmeal Valley, which was originally inhabited mostly by Scotchmen, but the only Scotch thing about it now is that Ev still enjoys eating Porridge.

In the July 1965 Charolais Newsletter Shirley Branum wrote: Ray was born in Craigmyle, AB. After completing his schooling there, he graduated from Royal Military College at Kingston, ON. From there he joined the Air Force, piloting Canso aircraft on the East Coast. This was where Ray and I met and married in 1944 in Nova Scotia. We came back to Alberta and rented some land to get our first start at farming. Ray's father ran a sub-experimental station for many years and here is where we first learned of the Charolais breed from none other than Harry Hargrave. Harry would show slides of these animals and in his most interesting talks about them gave Ray ideas that he would like to have some of this blood. He was not satisfied with the size of the cattle we were raising and so what seemed almost the impossible was very soon to be realized.

In a few years we acquired our own farm here at Craigmyle and at the same time we were blessed with our chosen daughter, Linda.

On July 6th, 1957 we imported our first bull and heifer from Keith Mets, at Holtville, CA. I'll never forget the fever of excitement over these. We got them along with a load of cattle that Fletcher Bennett of Pincher Creek also acquired from Keith Mets. We were so impressed with these cattle that we were soon back across the line to Nevada and Arizona to the Frank Campbell ranches to buy more cattle.

It did not seem to take us long to acquire a fairly high percentage cow herd of 60. Ray was always very concerned about performance testing these animals and keeping records on them. In 1963, Ray was able to go to the convention and was honored as having been the "Pioneer" President. That fall he became very ill and passed away on Feb. 3, 1964

The first yellow cattle appeared on 4C Charolais Farm as a result of a purebred Charolais bull leased for 22 days. That bull left 10 calves out of 19 cows. The steer calves were fed out with the Hereford sired contemporaries and when shipped to St. Boniface market netted \$79 per head over the contemporary's average. This made believers in Charolais out of the Clews.

Charolais Banner Sept. 1967 - Here at Craigmyle where the dry, flat east country of Alberta begins, it seems a far cry from the small Ontario town of Kincardine on the shores of Lake Huron, where I was born and raised. Being a town boy, there was not much opportunity to become acquainted with farming, but by working in summer holidays and then for a short time on a farm after my schooling, I managed to develop a liking for farm life which was to wait several years to be developed in earnest. I held a variety of jobs in Kincardine before leaving there in 1953 to spend five years in Indian Schools at Sioux Lookout, ON, Prince Albert, SK, and Wabasca, AB. It was while working in these schools that I met Willa, who hails from Gaspe, PQ., and we were married in Prince Albert.

Leaving Indian work in the spring of 1958, we were employed on a ranch south of Hardisty, AB where I was able to gain practical and valuable experience on farming and ranching operations as practiced in this part of the country and we were there until the fall of 1960 at which time we moved here to work for the Branum's. At that time the only white cows I had seen were white Shorthorn, but it did not take long to get brain-washed. I soon picked up the enthusiasm of my employer and under his expert guidance, it was not long before I was keeping records and waiting for weaning to see if this year's calf from such and such a cow would be better than last year's because she was bred to a different bull.

About a year after Ray's death, Mrs. Branum dispersed the herd which then numbered about 85 white cows, and we were fortunate in being able to purchase 20 head of females along with a bull she had recently purchased from the Char-Rouse Ranch. We felt that with performance tested cattle, we were on the right track and in the three years that we have been renting the Branum farm, we have had no cause to doubt this decision.

I finished my schooling at Edgerton, AB in the dry thirties. I was helping my father on the farm where rain never fell and lakes and wells went dry. We headed North to look for something better and when we crossed the North Saskatchewan River we found what we were looking for. We were in cattle country with plenty of water and thousands of acres of grass.

It was here I met Gladys. She was an expert rider at the time and still is, as she won a trophy from our Gymkhana Club in 1966. We both like good horses and spend a lot of time in the saddle.

We have two sons - Bobby, 20 years and Ricky, 18. They have won rate of gain and reserve champion in the 4-H with our Charolais calves.

I have enjoyed working with the other directors in the Alberta Charolais Association.

Around home I seem to keep busy as I'm President of our F.U.A. Local, Vice President of our Rural Electrification Association and Assistant Leader of our 4 -H Beef Club.

We're looking forward to getting our French Bull in the Spring. I say there's no turning back now. We have to try to make every generation of Charolais better than the last and I think every Charolais breeder is aiming at the same goal.

In the June 1965 Charolais Newsletter Vern wrote: I was raised on a farm just North of Estevan and was operating a dairy farm prior to moving into Estevan in 1949. The same year I married the former Lyla Snider and was employed by a plumbing and heating firm. I became a journeyman in this trade and was employed by the same firm until 1957 when I went with Simpson Sears where I became a Department Manager.

With always being a livestock lover, it was hard to get cattle out of my mind and in 1960 we purchased approx. 20 head of commercial Herefords, a Hereford-Charolais cross female and half interest in a percentage Charolais bull. After visiting several ranches in Alberta and the US and viewing their Charolais cattle, I became quite convinced that this was the breed. I purchased three 15/16 bred females and have been adding to the herd since.

We now have a herd of 46 head, mostly high percentage and purebred. When purchasing the first few Charolais females, onlookers just couldn't see paying that amount for these cattle and I must admit, they had me worried also. However, they can see now that this was a wise move and Charolais cattle are here to stay.

We care for the stock ourselves. However, I am reminded by Lyla quite often that when we moved to the country, I was just going to have a cow and a calf, being that I was a livestock lover. Charolais Banner March 1983 - Until the late 1960's, Flat Valley Farm was strictly a commercial cow/calf to feedlot operation finishing about 400 steers a year, most coming from Ehret's Hereford base cow herd. In 1968 Ehret bought a Charolais bull from Reg Phaff to use in the Flat Valley commercial herd. They found the Char-cross steer was working really well. They were getting better gains with the Char-cross and they were selling better on the rail. The first 15 purebred Charolais females arrived at Flat Valley in 1974. Things were destined to go well as the first calf crop produced 13 heifer calves. The Flat Valley purebred Charolais operation, which is partially owned and managed by son Gene, has expanded to about 80 females today.

Here I grew up and remained until the Dirty Thirties, working on different farms in the Hamiota District. I returned home in 1937 when my father died, and I started farming in the Lyleton District in 1938, in which area I am still located.

In 1944 I married Ellen Leach who was born and educated in Lyleton. We have four children: Arlyn is farming with me and living at home; our two daughters, Shirley and Elna, are attending Melita Collegiate; and our younger son, Dave is taking his grade eight in Lyleton Elementary School.

We are mixed farmers, having both grain and stock. We operate 3 3/4 sections of land, with seventeen hundred acres under cultivation, the balance in pasture and hay. We run a commercial herd of one hundred head of Char-Cross which range from 1/2 to 7/8. I originally had Shorthorn and disposed of the last of them and the 3/8 cows in the fall. In 1958 I saw Clare Gedde's advertisement with Char-Cross bulls for sale. I phoned him and made arrangements to go down and see these animals he had imported from Texas. I was impressed with these big white cattle

and purchased my first bull, a 3/4 Charolais, 1/4 Brahman from Clare that fall. In June of 1959 I imported three bred cows from McGinness Brothers.

Charolais Banner May 1973 - Eugene Foisy has been in purebred cattle for over 24 years. He started in 1949 with purebred polled Herefords but soon realized they didn't have the size and quality the horned cattle had. His idea then was to outcross within the breed and found a bull weighing 2700 lbs. with many of the traits he needed. To his dismay however, some of his offspring had scurs, so this bull was replaced with another which turned out strongly polled. By selecting for size and rate of gain even during a period when it wasn't popular, he developed a Hereford herd which in later years became known as having the most size and scale in Canada. It was really natural then for Gene to look at Charolais. He was impressed with their performance and in 1966 he sold the Hereford herd and went Charolais, again selecting for the same traits he'd built his Hereford reputation on.

Charolais Banner April 1973 - Lucien and Myrt were both journeyman bookbinders working in Toronto and in the fall of 1955 got the idea to buy some land near Barrie and commute to work. The roads were poor and during spring breakup Lucien found it impossible to get to work for several days. In those few days they got working at home and became so enthusiastic that they decided to give it a try for at least two years and stay if they liked it or move away if they didn't.

Myrt says, "I still wasn't sold on the idea after two years but we're still here." We had to have cows and pigs because we figured no farm was complete without cows and pigs.....In one way our inexperience was an asset ...We figured there was nothing prettier than a field of red white face cows on a green pasture so we bought some Hereford heifers. Our A.I technician said, "Say, you're French, we've got this new French breed.".....so we tied them. We didn't like the calves, other people said they were off color, so we didn't use Charolais the next year. As those first Charolais calves grew to yearlings alongside some straight-breds we saw the difference in growth and that meant something to us and that sold us on Charolais. Although we first tried Charolais in 1956, the first calves we recorded were born in 1960. By 1963 we were totally involved in grading up.

Charolais Banner Jan. 1967 - It has been a long way from the windswept shores of Nova Scotia with its fishing lines and lobster traps to the grassy slopes of the Prairie, where my family came in April 1904; landing in Maple Creek, Assinibois (now Saskatchewan). There were seven children in the family, five boys and two girls, I being the youngest. The family started ranching on the south side of the Cypress Hills that same summer, with 25 cows of all colors and a bull part Highland.

In the space of 41 years the ranch grew into one of the largest ranches in Canada, spreading into Alberta, until it was sold in 1945. Someone asked me the other day how we managed to keep on the increase and I said it was just like Topsy who just grew.

Over the first ten years we bought cattle of every color and shape, a lot coming from Manitoba, and until 1914 we used grade bulls of various colors. In the fall of that year we bought in a carload of purebred Hereford bulls from Illinois: I think the first full carload to be brought into that part of the country. We used registered bulls until the ranches were sold, our cattle going up in quality until about 1926. Then with the best bulls we could afford, the average weight of the steers seemed a little less each year.

When Gilchrist Brothers Ranches were sold in 1945 I bought back the Deer Creek Ranch and started out again with fairly good cattle, and registered Hereford bulls. From a high of 800 pounds on the average for a few years, the weights of yearling steers in the fall have dropped back to about 760 pounds, repeating the earlier findings, or trend.

In 1957 my brother Rube brought up some Charolais 7/8 bulls from Frank Campbell in Arizona and as all the Rube's neighbors were giving him such a bad time over these "white Holsteins" he almost gave me a couple to try. The first few days I was tempted to take them to the packing house to see if they really had all this red meat they talked about, but my wife wouldn't let me!

She said Rube would be offended and we could put them in a back pasture where they couldn't do our herd any harm quality-wise.

But today our thinking has changed a lot about Charolais. We have found that with the Charolais crossed on any of the British beef breeds we get 70-100 pounds more growth on our yearling steers at market time.

I am not saying what kind of cattle the other fellow should have, but Charolais have been good to us. The cattle industry needs all the beef breeds if it is to get the best out of crossbreeding. Our ranch is now an all-out supporter of these white, easy to handle, aggressive cattle, and is operated by our son Tom, who is equally enthusiastic. Our cross breeding is a three way program, with Black Angus, Hereford and Charolais.

 Charolais Banner June/July 1967 - In February 1949, I had the privilege of spending a day with Fred Turner at his ranch at Weslace, Texas. Here I had my first opportunity to see Charolais cattle and hear of their merits from the man who made the first Charolais importations of the breed from Mexico to the US. Fred Turner was one of the most enthusiastic salesmen I have ever had the pleasure of meeting. His enthusiasm for Charolais cattle ran parallel to his enthusiasm for Ford products - he was the top Ford salesman in the US for several years. In the course of this fascinating visit with Fred Turner, I learned a lot about Charolais cattle and the people in Mexico and the US who were raising them. At that time I am sure he knew most of the breeders as well as the pedigrees of the individual cattle they were raising. I had a camera with me and took colored pictures of a number of the good Charolais bulls and cows that were then jointly owned by Fred Turner and Harl Thomas of Raymodville, Texas. These colored slides were used frequently in the ensuing years to help describe the characteristics of Charolais cattle in discussions with many groups of livestock producers in Western Canada. Among the people that Fred Turner talked about was an individual by the name of Frank Campbell who then ranched at Ash Fork, Arizona. I decided that Frank Campbell was a

Charolais breeder that I would like to meet and scheduled my travels in the direction of Ash Fork. Upon arrival at the ranch I missed Frank and his wife Floye, who were away in Mexico on Charolais business. However, I had the good fortune to meet their three sons - Hugh, Bob and Bill. The boys took me in tow and showed me the results obtained by mixing Charolais blood with a herd of several thousand good commercial Herefords under rugged range conditions. I was impressed with the cattle and the family involved with them. What I saw convinced me that Charolais cattle had a place in Canada. Frequent visits with all the members of the Campbell family during the past 18 years have confirmed this viewpoint and produced one of the finest friendships that my wife Ruth and I have enjoyed in a lifetime of association with livestock people. Since 1955 Frank Campbell has made many Charolais cattle available to Canadian cattlemen and has made numerous visits to Canada to encourage commercial and purebred Charolais breeders.

A milestone in Canadian Charolais history that I recall was a meeting in my office at Lethbridge, in the summer of 1958 with Wayne Malmberg, his brother Max, whose tragic death occurred recently, and John Ballachey of Calgary. Plans were then made for the organization meeting of the Canadian Charolais Association which was held in Calgary in January, 1959. The growth and development of the Association since that time has been phenomenal and is a tribute to enthusiastic and energetic membership.

It is my hope that Charolais breeders will maintain the profitable factors inherent in the breed - size, rapid growth, length of body, rugged bone and scale, minimum fat cover, large eye of lean, good carcass cut-out and adaptability to Canadian conditions. I would be unfortunate if the show ring encourages over-fat, thick, compact cattle in the breed. Performance and progeny testing are valuable tools for the Charolais breeder, and they should be used to maintain and improve individual herds.

Charolais Banner April 1968 - I was born on the farm, not too far from our present site and after “finishing” school which didn’t take too many years during the 30’s, I worked on my father’s farm joining in on the baseball, curling and general activities of that time.

In 1947 I took some time to travel to California and then to Vancouver where I worked in a logging camp until the end of the season.

The year of 1951, I married Jean who was nursing at Redvers, and we spent the winter in BC where we both worked. After returning home we moved to Fairlight, SK where I had a garage and Massey-Harris dealership - my first lesson in buying, selling and finance. I leased the garage in 1955 and we moved to Revers.

In 1956 I purchased a cat and did oil-field work and general construction. In 1958 I rented 1,100 acres from Arm River Farms and three years later acquired another 640 acres. This, along with my own land gave us sizeable acres with the bulk of it being pasture land; I could see it was time to get into the cattle business. By this time the construction business had grown considerably so it wasn’t until 1964 that the opportunity arose. A friend of mine was selling out and moving North and I had a chance to purchase his entire herd of sixty Hereford cows, all descendants of the original Arm River Herd.

The question now was, “What do we use for a herd sire”? Wanting more size I went to Wilf Edgars Fall sale at Innisfail, AB, where I purchased two young Hereford bulls. They didn’t develop the way I thought they should so it was at this time I started gathering information on Charolais. I had read articles on them before and kept mentioning to Jean that Charolais would sure be an opportunity for someone. I decided at this point to get a purebred bull so I wrote to Rodney to get a list of some of the top breeders in the US. On receiving the information we started south, looking at different herds, and at Litton Charolais Ranch decided on our herd sire. This of course was just the start of the “fever” and led to the purchase of a number of females. My favorite quote:’ It’s not how big they get, it’s how fast they get big.”

In the June 1964 Charolais Newsletter Rodney wrote: I was born and raised on a farm at Ponoka, AB. When 19 I took over the home farm and a year later Pearl and I were married. We

farmed there for four years, at which time Pearl had a re-occurrence of TB and went to the Sanatorium in Edmonton. We sold out our equipment, some cattle and put the rest of our Herefords out on shares.

I commenced work as a technician with the Lacombe Artificial Breeding Assn. and moved in with my mother at Ponoka. She and Pearl's mother shared the duties of taking care of Bob and our recent addition, Lorna.

It was during this period, after reading articles in the Canadian Cattlemen, Family Herald and US magazines, I had become interested in Charolais. We visited the Fletcher Bennetts, the late Ray Branum, Ed Lyon and Bud Tull, who all had recently imported Charolais and Charolais-cross from the US.

In the Spring of 1958, Pearl seemed to be well on the mend and town living had just about got the better of me, so we purchased the home quarter and moved to the Lacombe district. I now had my Herefords back home, so decided to cross them with Charolais using AI. The following spring, seeing my cross-calves, I was more enthused than ever. While discussing Charolais at the Ponoka Auction Mart with a farmer neighbour, the man in front overheard our conversation. On introducing himself as Orvil Rawe from Strome, he informed me that his brother, Jim Rawe, was presently in Arizona buying a carload of Charolais. He gave me the hotel that Jim was staying in, so I phoned Jim and placed an order for two 7/8 and one 3/4 heifers. The 3/4 turned out to be a non-breeder, so my money was refunded. The two 7/8 both had heifers that spring and I was in the Charolais business.

We attended the organizational meeting of the CCA on Jan. 17, 1959 in Calgary, even though we didn't actually have any Charolais. We attended the first Annual Meeting in 1960 and at the 1961 Annual Meeting I was elected to the Board of Directors. In 1962, at the meeting held in Lethbridge, I was elected Secretary-Treasurer.

The CCA office was at Maple Creek, SK with Marjorie E.F. Paton ably carrying on the duties of Recording Secretary on a part time basis. A year later, it appeared that the CCA had grown to where it was now a full time job. The Board felt that perhaps better continuity could be attained by combining the duties of Recording-Secretary and Secretary-Treasurer into one full time position. I was offered the opportunity of taking over these combined offices and after a long sleepless night we reached a decision: I accepted this offer and resigned from the Lacombe Artificial Breeding Assn., where I had been employed for over 6 years. On March 1, 1963 the CCA office was moved to our home at Lacombe with Marjorie Paton remaining on until April 1st, teaching me the various office techniques.

I was born and raised on the banks of the Nation River in Prescott Country, just east of Ottawa. My parents, Mr. and Mrs. Oliva Lalonde, had seven boys and one girl. They farmed all their working days, and are now retired and live in the village of Fournier, ON. While attending elementary and secondary schools, I spent my weekends and summer holidays working on the farm. I attended Kemptville Agricultural School in Guelph, ON. In 1933, I

started out expecting a position but was fortunate to get a job. After some experience in poultry and egg grading in the commercial field, I spent some ten years as a poultry products inspector with the Dominion Government working mostly in Ontario with a short time in Montreal.

In 1938, I married Marguerite Beaulieu and our home has been blessed with three girls, and of late, we have added to the family two fine sons-in-laws, one who now own some horses and two Charolais cross cows.

We started crossing Charolais on our Herefords and Shorthorns in 1957. We also have some 60 horses specializing in Appaloosa and American Saddle Bred horses.

Since we started cross-breeding Charolais, we have always sold our cross-bred Charolais bulls for good prices to farmers wishing to crossbreed on a commercial herd to increase the size of their calves and also the rate of growth of their calf crop. We have had a lot of repeat orders because when a farmer tries Charolais he usually stays with it. In fact, now we have a big demand for Charolais cross-bred females.

We firmly believe that the commercial beef breeder and commercial feeder of the future will want to cross-breed with Charolais to get extra vigor, extra size and faster rate of gain. The poultryman and the grain corn grower have long ago recognized the value of cross breeding for the extra vigor. It is hard to believe, but some hybrid corn varieties often yield more per acre than either of the parent stock used in cross breeding. Of more recent years, the hog men have recognized the real value of cross breeding.

Our farm is within the city limits of Brockville. I have been manager of the Brookville Co-operative Assn. for 21 years, and have also been active in many organizations such as Past President of the Canadian Landrace Assn, the Co-op Union of Ontario, the Brockville Rotary Club, the Vincent de Paul Hospital Board in Brockville. At the present time I am Chairman of the Brockville Separate School Board, Vice President of the Brockville Memorial Centre Board, Vice-President of the Rotary Pool Board, Director of Leeds Co-op Medical Services, of the 4H Beef and Poultry Club in the Country for several years, a Director and on the executive of the Co-op Fire and Casualty Company, all with the Head Office in Regina, SK. As a director of the Co-op Insurance Companies I have travelled to every province of Canada, except Newfoundland. In my travel I like to visit Co-ops especially farm oriented ones and I also try to visit Charolais breeders whenever possible in other areas.

I am very busy but enjoy my work and hobbies, and especially my home and farm. We travel some with our house trailer on weekends.

After giving you some of my activities is it any wonder my wife Marguerite sometimes says, "Why don't you stay home and rest a little?"

Charolais Banner Nov. 1968 - First of all, we were born and raised here at Cadillac, SK and have spent most of our time on the farm with our father. The farm wasn't as big in those days of course, but in addition to the farming he always had cattle - Shorthorn. Now we farm four and one half sections and run more cattle.

In 1939 the P.F.R.A. took over land to make community pastures to help farmers raise more cattle. Dad put his herd in with the others. The bulls used were Herefords. From this cross we kept the females from the best producing cows.

In the early 1950's we were getting an American magazine, "The Farm Quarterly" and it was in here that we first learned of the great white cattle. At that time their rate of gain was hard to believe, so we wrote for information and prices....however were disappointed when none arrived. While visiting friends in Alberta we again heard of the Charolais. There was a herd close by so we visited the rancher and bought a bull from the late Ray Branum. It was a 3/4 and as we were living in a purebred area, we never got him home (Mr. Branum returned our money), however it was a second disappointment.

In 1958 while attending a friend's wedding at Fort Macleod, we heard of Mr. Fletcher Bennet's herd. This time we bought a purebred bull - Etienne J B 2, MC21. He was bred by Judd Bridge Farms, New Milford, Conn., and this put us in the Charolais business. Up to this year we had bought only one domestic female. We have bought bulls and bred A.I.

Charolais Newsletter June 1966 - Enola Laveck wrote: Bud Laveck was born in Crossfield, AB and spent the first 9 years of his life in Water Valley. He finished his schooling in Airdrie, where he worked with his stepfather, John Fletcher, on his farm. Several years of 4H Club work stimulated Bud's interest in cattle.

After our marriage in 1951, we took a temporary job with Don McKinnon at Carsland, while he went on a trip to Phoenix. When spring seeding came, we took a prearranged job with Ed McKinnon at Airdrie and Bud was able to continue his 4H work.

Upon leaving Ed's ranch in 1953 we went to work for Victor Watson on his Willow Springs Ranch at Airdrie. Bud spent 8 of the 16 months we were at the ranch in a leg cast when his knee went into a forage harvester. However, it was due to Mr. Watson putting Bud in charge as manager here on his Sarcee Agricultural Lease, that gave us the chance to have some stock of our own. Brushing, breaking and farming many acres and pasturing many more, Mr. Watson allowed us to keep a limited number of cows as part of our wages.

Bud's interest in the "Silver Cattle with the Golden Future" had been growing for some time and he decided he wanted to try some cross breeding. He visited several people raising Charolais, one of the first being Ed Lyons. An ad in the Cattlemen took us to Pincher Creek and Fletcher Bennets, where we bought our first Charolais Bull Etienn JB, affectionally called "Tiny" by the family. This was in late August of 1959. We were too late for breeding that year but put him with some big purebred Herefords anyway.

The spring of 1959 brought 11 crossbred calves and even though they were later than the other calves, at weaning time they were as heavy as the other calves and considerably heavier than some.

In July 1959 Bud made a trip to Strome and purchased five femals from the AAA Ranch. Several trips to Ray Branum's Ranch at Craigmyle convinced us that the Charolais-cross was the one to have. We have since bought a purebred bull from Shirley Branum and are very pleased with him.

We have sold some Charolais, but mostly we have exchanged cross bred cows for our original stock until we have only a few without some Charolais cross in them. We have a few registered Angus cows that delight us each year by weaning a Charolais-Angus cross calf almost as big as the cows themselves. This is Bud's choice of cross, but he likes them all.

Bud took his better bred Charolais to his stepfather in Airdrie and they formed a partnership, Fletcher and Laveck. They use mostly A.I. and are pleased with the results. Bud's young brother, Wayne takes care of the records for them

In the October 1965 Charolais Newsletter Ed Lyons wrote: I born and grew up on a farm twenty miles east of Calgary in the Strathmore, Cheadle district. In the dirty thirties when a good cow was worth only twelve or fifteen dollars, I decided there was no future in farming so I went to work in the Turner Valley oilfield. While with this oil company, we drilled at the Kinsella gas fields where I met my wife, Millie, who was working at Viking. Millie was born in Consort and spent her early years on her parents' farm. After working six years in the oil fields, we bought the service station where we now live. Most of my customers being mixed farmers, I became involved in the cattle business. My uncle, a Charolais breeder in Louisiana, questioned how a Charolais would winter in Canada. Visiting us in 1955, and finding we had ample pasture, he inquired if we would be interested in this breed of cattle. Arrangements were made and in 1956 a shipment of 30 heifers and one bull arrived.

In that year we had people from all across Canada visit our herd, many wishing to purchase, some left orders to be filled. The next year I flew down to H.M. Kimball's ranch in Louisiana who has an interest in a Charolais Co. in Mexico. From him I purchased a cattle liner load to fill a part of the demand.

Having a family of four boys, I instigated the forming of a 4-H Beef Club. Different years we showed Charolais-crosses at our show and sale. We are particularly proud of a Charolais-Angus cross Terry showed four years ago at the Calgary baby beef show and sale. This calf at sixteen months weighed 1430 pounds.
