In the April 1966 Charolais Newsletter Max Malberg wrote: Eleven years ago my wife, Ardath and I went to Wellington, Colorado to buy a 3/4 Charolais bull from Clint Ferris. This bull was so homely we nearly left him there. However, he had the scale, volume and general get-up-and-go so lacking in the Herefords back home that we decided to take him. We christened him Pandit Pierre. Pandit for his Indian ancestry and Pierre for his French. What he lacked in good looks, he made up in personality. I believe Pandit was the third bull of Charolais blood to enter Canada.

He was a terrific breeder and left scale and general do-ability in every calf that he sired. His first calf crop came in 1956 consisting of forty-three head of calves. The top ten of this group had the top ten of some two hundred Herefords of my dad's and brother's Gordon, Orville and Evan,

beaten by 93 pound per calf and that sent them scurrying to Colorado for a truck load of Charolais bulls in October 1957.

I sold the first Charolais-cross steers in Canada. Ian Davidson of Calgary Packers bought these on a rail grade basis. They graded nine red label and one blue label, all exceptionally fine carcasses. He remarked that they might not look so good on the hoof, but that on the hook they are beauties.

I sold one of Pandit's daughters of '56 just before Christmas. She weighed 1440 pounds and sold for \$13.80, a total of \$198.72. The same day I sold a '56 Hereford and she was as good as they come. She weighed 1220 and brought \$12.80 for a total of \$156.15. Both of these cows had lost their calves in the spring and were sold off grass and snow. Old Pandit made me \$42.56 more that day and I guess that is the story of his life. We sold him in the fall of '64 out of the breeding pasture at 2300 pounds. The family didn't dare eat baloney for months.

In the Spring of 1958, I bought a purebred bull from Clint Ferris that I bred to Pandit Pierre's daughters. Mr. Fletcher Bennett of Pincher Creek, brought in a car load of bulls from the Judd Bridge Farms in Connecticut, US. These bulls arrived and I beat my brothers there for the first choice, and got that great bull Bevon Jr. His daughters not only look good, they are good. I believe Bevon has made quite a contribution to the Charolais industry in Canada. But enough bull about my bulls.

The Charolais cattle have been good to me. I am proud I had a part to play in the formation of the Charolais Association. It is gratifying now to see that the policy of registering A.I. sired calves, that some of us argued so strongly to support, has proven to be the tool of advantage that we thought it would.

I believe that the next goal of this association should be to bring about a change in the ridiculous system of grading carcasses so the producer of superior meat carcasses will be rewarded for such.

In the May 1965 Charolais Newsletter Wayne Malmberg wrote: We brought the first Charolais cattle in April, 1955, a recorded 7/8 bull and a 3/4 cow. We were also the first to market Charolais crossbred cattle. The press gave a great deal of publicity to this new breed and we were cussed and discussed in many parts of Canada.

I suppose pioneering came naturally to me. Around 1859 my great grandfather crossed the Atlantic Ocean from Sweden to New York in a sailboat. From New York he proceeded with his family to Independence, Missouri. He crossed the plains to Utah with an ox team. My grandfather, who was four at the time, often recalled in his stories how the train was divided at the Platt River by a herd of buffalo, so numerous that they took five hours to pass.

The family farmed in Utah with oxen and built up a sheep herd, which they trailed to Oregon in the 1890's. The sheep were traded for horses, which the family trailed through Washington and British Columbia to High River, AB in 1904.

Mother and Dad homesteaded 24 miles east of there, where the town of Herronton, AB now stands. I was born there in 1906, the second child of seven children; two girls and five boys. I attended a country school, and high school at High River. The school of "Hard Knocks" in the dirty '30's completed my education.

In 1918 my Dad purchased a large ranch at Spring Coulee 35 miles southwest of Lethbridge. This ranch was run as a company until it was paid for in 1945. At that time the ranch was equally divided between Dad and the five boys.

Georgia and I were married in 1948. Ours is a mixed family: mine, hers and ours. They are: my daughter Leah; Georgia's children Arlene, Dale and Gary; our 13 year old daughter Mavis; and seven grandchildren.

I have tried raising almost everything that would make or lose money: wheat, oats, barley, flax, horses, pigs, chickens, sheep and cattle. I have sold good steers for a low as \$3.00 per hundred to as high as \$33 . Georgia and I have an agreement that if we ever sell steers that high again I will buy her a pink Cadillac.

In 1953 I became interested in Charolais cattle. We visited the ranches of Fred Turner and Arl Thomas in Texas, and Clint Ferris in Wyoming. It was at this time I was invited to become a Founder Member of the Certified Improved Charolais Association, which later became known as the Pan American Charolais Association. The other founder members are Clint Ferris, Bill Sidley, Joe Hewitt, Cliff Aultman and Buddy Cobb.

The conflict between the various Charolais Associations in the United States made me realize the need for an organization to record Charolais cattle in Canada.

In the fall of 1958 Ray Branum, John Ballachey, Harry Hargrave, Max Malmberg, Fletcher Bennett and I met in Lethbridge, to discuss the formation of a Canadian Association. This group extended invitations to all Canadians interested in breeding Charolais cattle to attend a meeting to be held in the Palliser Hotel in Calgary on January 17, 1959. This meeting resulted in the formation of the Canadian Charolais Association, with Ray Branum as its first President.

McHattie runs three Purebred Charolais farms at Bailieboro, ON near Peterborough. When he is not dashing from one to another of his three rented farms, he is working as a full-time insurance adjuster for the Co-op, or handling his chores as treasurer for Triangle Sales Management, a local company run by himself, Don Burgomaster and Larry Leahy, neighboring Charolais breeders.
“I started out with a Hereford. The second cow I bought was a black/white face; the third was Durham and the fourth one was a Charolais and the fifth was an Angus. So I was going to see which one was the best. After the first calf crop I got \$380 for the Charolais calf and \$280 maximum for the other calves; they were all born about the same time in 1972.....So one thing led to another and I got a few more Charolais around”.

Charolais Banner May 1974 - I am presently farming 1 1/2 sections of land that was settled by my father and uncle in 1906. It is highly productive for growing either grain or grass and is well situated being 25 miles N.W. of Winnipeg on the edge of Manitoba's Interlake Region.

After completing my secondary education I took the Diploma Course in Agriculture at the University of Manitoba, receiving my diploma in 1952. Then I earned a private pilot's license, along with a wife in 1960.

When I was fourteen, I started with four registered Hereford cows which I built into a herd of 35 registered females, mostly polled. I sold this herd in 1965, keeping one old semi-crippled cow which was A.I.'d to King John. She gave me a 1/2 cross heifer calf in 1966. This calf was my reason for going back into cattle with Charolais being the obvious choice.

Charolais Banner Feb. 1977 - In 1955 he bought a 15,000 acre ranch in the east end of the Island of Molokai in Hawaii and set about stocking it with cattle. Having seen and heard about Charolais in his extensive travels, he brought over both Charolais and Charbray bulls and heifers. Like many early Charolais breeders, he found his way to the Litton Ranch and there bought nine bulls - all sons of Sam 951.

Coupled to the production problem was finding a market for the beef. In Hawaii most of the beef market was controlled by the big Parker Ranch with only one packing plant on the Islands. The herd on Molokai had by that time grown to 2500 and Murphy had to find a market for them. In 1966 three ranches were bought at Grove, Oklahoma and 1250 cows and calves were selected to be shipped from Molokai to San Francisco and then on to the ranches at Grove.

All this took place during a time when exciting and significant events were happening in Canada. The importation program had been established and Fullblood Charolais were being imported direct from France.

Murphy established a base in Canada with the purchase of four farms and set about building a Full French herd - G M Charolais

In the Charolais Newsletter April 1964 - Ivan Ohler wrote: My wife Vilda and I are not only real cattle enthusiasts, but are great horse lovers as well. My first interest in Charolais cattle was in 1954 while spending the winter in California where I saw some Charolais Angus cross steers. Then I visited the Ray Sence, Keith Mets and Hunt's herds in California. These cattle impressed me immensely, but since I was down with my car, I was unable to take a bull back home. Then we met Harry Hargrave for the first time in 1957 and he again re-aroused our interest in Charolais cattle. My wife and I then decided to take my parents (who were in partnership with us in the cattle business at that time) on a tour of the top U.S. Charolais breeders. Ray arrived only a few hours before we reached the Lucky 7 Ranch at McDermitt, Nevada, with his cattle liner rented to take back a mixed load of cows and bulls to his ranch. In the spring of 1958 we brought back two loads of Charolais cows, heifers and bulls also from the Lucky 7 Ranch. They had been shipped there from the Ashfork Livestock Company. These were our first Charolais stock. Since then our enthusiasm has grown year by year. We have been breeding up a Charolais herd and also crossing our Angus cows with Charolais until today we have a herd of purebred and recorded Charolais numbering 173.

Charolais Banner Jan. 1973 - Ted Perrin, Pete Perrin's nephew, who is in charge of the Charolais herd says "I guess you'd say we've been crossbreeding ever since we started." Pete was with the Matador Community Pasture in 1930 when the U. of S. in Saskatoon ran the first scientific crossbreeding project. They used four different breeds of cows and would use one breed of bulls for two years, then switch and use another breed for two years. This way they had one set of straight bred and three crossbred sets of calves each year. When Pete bought the West Ranch the cows were mainly Herefords and in 1943 he started crossbreeding with Hereford and Angus bulls. In the late 40's he tried Shorthorn bulls, but this cross couldn't stand the severe winters so he dropped them. In the early 50's he tried one Brahman bull but dropped him because he didn't throw true to type, the cows milked so heavy that they came in skinny in the fall and couldn't stand the cold winter. In 1963 when I was Foreman on the Matador, I took an A.I. course and in 1964 I came with Pete on this ranch. We'd read and talked about Charolais for a long time and in 1966 we got a freezer and bred 35 cows to Charolais bulls. We'd heard stories how Charolais wouldn't rustle with the British breeds. This may or may not have been true with the early Brahman crosses, but we sure didn't find that with ours. Our Char-cross cows ranged the furthest on the winter grazing pastures and were the last to come back to the buildings in the winter.

In the March 1966 Charolais Newsletter Mary R. Richardt wrote: When Otto W. Richardt of Belle Vue Dairy Farm, southeast of Saskatoon, brought the first Charolais to the Saskatoon area in August 1958, it was not unusual - for he has specialized in "pioneering firsts" all his life. Mr. Richardt saw the giant white super-beef cattle at a fair in Texas when he and Mrs. Richardt were holidaying in the southern USA. The breed not only fascinated him but their potential so intrigued him that he made immediate arrangements to import several head for his own farm. Mr. Richardt came to Saskatoon from Wisconsin in 1909, bringing with him six Holstein heifers, the first of that breed to come into this part of Saskatchewan. Later, he augmented his herd by bringing in the first Guernseys to this area. His Holsteins and Guernseys took many first prizes at the Saskatoon Exhibition in the mid-1920.

After holidaying in Wisconsin in 1956, where he visited A.I. units in Watertown and Waupun, he brought the intimate knowledge and enthusiasm which resulted in the formation of the Saskatoon A.I. Co-Op, the first in the province and which continues as the largest in Saskatchewan. At that time, the farmers said, "if Otto is pushing this, it will be a success", and it is.

His interests have not been limited to the production level but included active work in organizing the Saskatoon Dairy Pool, on whose Board of Directors he served for ten years.

Recognizing the importance and necessity of keeping adequate records if production of quality milk in quantity is to be advanced, Mr. Richardt organized the Saskatoon Herd Improvement Association in the late 1920's, served as one of the early presidents and was on its executive board for many years. In 1957, Mr. Richardt's herd won the Star Phoenix Trophy for the greatest increase in milk and butterfat production in one year in the province.

To provide adequate feed for his substantial dairy herd, Mr. Richardt experimented with growing fodder corn and in 1921 produced the first such crop in this area. However, the cool prairie nights were not conducive to the development of the corn and in 1924 he grew the first sunflowers in quantity to fill his concrete upright silo, also a first in the district. His was also the first to use a windmill for pumping water and the first in this district to have White Plymouth Rocks - they took many firsts at the Saskatoon Exhibition.

Prior to coming to Saskatoon, Mr. Richardt did the organizational work for a cheese factory near Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Aside from the dairy business, this man of firsts organized the Homewood School District in 1920 and was its first chairman and continued as chairman for 30 years. He is a charter member of Augustana Lutheran Church, Saskatoon, and has served as deacon and trustee.

Mr. Richardt was on the first Board of Directors of the Canadian Charolais Association. He is still keenly interested in the association, even though physically incapacitated which restricts his activities.

John Rudiger passed away May 18, 2018

In the Charolais Newsletter May 1954 - John Rudiger wrote: 1959 was a memorable year for the Rudigers, a year that changed our lives socially and economically. Socially - as we have met and made many new friends and attended many gatherings and meetings across Canada, United States and Mexico. Economically - as we never believed that a person could go so far into debt for just a few "white animals". For it was early February of 1959 that we travelled to Texas and purchased our first Charolais herd from the Michaelis Ranch in Kyle, Texas. Our first importation was 8 (15/16 and purebred) heifers and a bull (Santa Claus). They were often referred to as Santa Claus and his eight reindeer. Being one of the pioneers of Charolais in Saskatchewan, people wondered if perhaps we weren't off on a "wild goose chase". Since then we have made three more importations from Texas, and one from B.C., and our Charolais herd has increased to over 100.

After spending four years in the Royal Canadian Air Force Motor Transport Division, Wilf returned home, married Doris Bargholz from the neighboring community and through the VLA bought a half section of land six miles south of his father's farm. Doris' brother, Ken Bargholz, who was living at Kindersley at the time, had been using Charolais semen on his own cows, and Wilf was so impressed with the performance of the crossbred calves that he bought a half-Charolais bull from Ken. They also bought a Charolais

bull from Ray Braunum in 1959. The foundation for the Wildor herd was laid in 1966, when direct buying from France became possible.

They have increased their holdings to six and 1/4 sections, with three thousand acres under cultivation. They grow mainly wheat, oats and barley. Until 1974 they fed approximately four hundred steers a year, but since then have decided to go into a straight breeding program.

Charolais Banner April 1971 - Another "young fellow", new in the Charolais business is Denzil Sutton, of Rocanville. Denzil and Wilma have for a reason taken a shine to the polled Charolais (perhaps it's their 23 years with polled Herefords?). When Denzil sold his large Hereford herd, his plans were to purchase only 25 or 30 cows, however, his herd now has 72 females with 52 calving this spring.

Charolais Banner June 1974 - I was born in Peterborough, On near my grandfather's farm where registered Clydesdale horses were raised and sold. Dad worked on the farm in summer and drove lead teams in lumber camps in winter, then rode the logs on river drives each spring down to the mills. In the fall of 1915, Dad came west on a harvester excursion to Sceptre, SK. He liked the country so much that he sold our house in Peterborough, gathered up some good horses and in 1916 we all moved to the Sceptre area. We've always had cattle, first Shorthorn, then Herefords. In 1937 no crop, no feed, so we sold everything in July but our two year old heifers for \$10.00 per head and I rode cattle cars to Ontario. I worked as apprentice mechanic there until fall of '38 when my father had heart trouble.

Dad had gathered up more cattle to hold our lease, and prices were still low, so after harvest I rented the local butcher shop (that had gone broke) and with no experience we marketed the ranch cattle this way. The shop expanded to handle groceries, and we developed a 74 mile delivery route twice a week to bring fresh meat to two adjoining towns.

In December 1940 I married Wilma Cropp, a pretty Sceptre school teacher. Wilma had been raised on a cattle and grain farm in eastern Saskatchewan not far from our present ranch. She had a thorough knowledge of cattle, having done most of the riding for her father.

Then along came the war, we sold the store and everything but Wilma's piano, made a down payment on a half section farm and rented it to a brother. Each place I was stationed, Wilma was

able to get steady employment. Then I went on an all-expense paid trip to Europe including the Aramanches beach head.

We took over a herd of commercial Herefords with the farm and after two years we came to the conclusion that either we or the Herefords would have to go..

We were also very impressed by the open A.I. policy of the Canadian Charolais Association and we still feel that this is our best tool for constantly improving the breed.

We bought our first Charolais in 1965 and now have 30 females, mostly purebreds. We still have 30 head of Herefords which we are crossbreeding. Of these calves we have had 7 months weaning weights of 610 lbs.

As a cash crop we grow 12 acres of Foundation Seed potatoes.

I enjoy belonging to the Canadian Charolais Association and have great pleasure in meeting all the pleasant and enthusiastic people at the conventions.

We live in the beautiful Windermere Valley (renamed Charolais Valley) and hope any of you travelling in the district will drop in for a visit.

Charolais Banner March 1968 - I was raised in Calgary, the son of an elementary school principal, but I always had a yen for the farm and for livestock. An opportunity was never passed up to visit and work on my uncles' farms

Eleven years ago I graduated in Engineering from Oklahoma University. Six months later Jackie (a native Oklahoman) and I were married. I have worked in the oil business in Calgary since graduation. Currently I am Production Manager for Amax Petroleum Corp.

About 5 years ago I made my move into the cattle business with my brother Grant and with the advice of Carl Skibsted, a retired Polled Hereford breeder. We bought a small commercial herd. Our search for the right man to look after them led us to the farm of John Wilson of Lacombe. Our relationship with John and his family has been most enjoyable.

My subscription to the Canadian Cattleman took over from my oil magazines. The first articles to catch my eye were those pertaining to performance testing. Then those on cross-breeding as a rapid means of advancement in performance. Then came the articles on Charolais, the breed which was currently contributing the most to improvements in performance in beef cattle, both as a pure breed and in crossbreeding.

The spring of 1966 brought the need for a new bull for our commercial operation. An ad pertaining to the A.C.A. sale at Stettler caught my eye and we went out there and solved the bull problem in a hurry. However, it opened the door and I caught a very bad case of Charolais fever. Before we had any Char-cross calves, I sold John the commercial cows and the bull and went looking for Charolais breeding stock. By the way, the calves proved up the merits of commercial crossbreeding with Charolais bulls and John was my first customer for a commercial Charolais bull from my own breeding herd.

My basic breeding stock was purchased from Ron Rouse, Rodney James, Don Pochylko and Ken Bargholz. Since I was looking for quality regardless of percentage, I ended up with everything from half bloods to 15/16 Charolais cows.

Our program is built around a 6 week A.I. season plus the services of a top pickup bull. My goal right now is a fairly small herd concentrating on the improvement and up-breeding of the basic cow herd. I hope to increase the amount of French influence in the herd with selected bulls as they prove out. I hope to import fullblood French stock also.

Charolais Newsletter Sept. 1965 - Bud Tull wrote: I started out in life and still live about 1 miles from where my Dad homesteaded. He came from Kentucky in 1902 with only a mule horse and a walking plow. My formal education was a bit lengthy, 12 years in school which I never liked, 2 years at Olds Ag College, plus 3 years at U of A.

Since horses have always come before women and cows, we began raising Percherons when I was about 16. We ended up with a fairly good string of bucking horses, so I was a rodeo contractor for a few years, but the rest were sold for about \$10.00 a head. From there we started raising Thoroughbreds and found out that we just had good chuck-wagon horses, so our outfit ran the circuit for 10 years. At present we have Arabians and some Walking Horses.

The cattle business has progressed much the same way - from Hereford to Brangus and then Charolais. In 1940 I had a little argument with some polio bugs and sent 18 month in hospital and darn near lost the fight. My dad passed away in 1945 and left me with a lot of land and twice as many mortgages to pay off. It was either make a go of it or go broke. Very fortunately I had a lot of good help - all except a cook - so I married Irene in 1947.

We were all set up to go but the cattle were not paying and our small well bred heifers gave a lot of trouble reproducing. Our old veterinarian, Dr. Block said to me one day, "Boy, if you intend to make any money with cattle, you're going to have to raise them bigger and longer".

For the next few years I used Brangus bulls and had no luck. The next breed to try was Charolais, so in 1956 I imported a few cows and a bull from Ross Parker at Hagerman, Idaho.

The first calf produced was performance tested at the University of Alberta and did so well I had to promise not to publicize the results. Consequently this was our new breed for the future and we purchased 12 heifers from Earl Thode at Caca Grande, Arizona. At the same time I bought a bull from Herb Hawthorne at Meridian, Texas, which proved to be no good and his replacement even worse. So from then on I used A.I.

I haven't promoted the breed too much because I sell the poorer ones for beef and keep only the top ones for our herd. No doubt we've turned in more papers to the association dead animal file than anyone in Canada. Never the less, Charolais are good profitable cattle no matter how you sell them. If our breeders continue performance testing and not looking for the fast buck, we will produce bulls with a 5 lb. gain and a 6 lb. conversion on hay. This will continue to make them the most profitable cattle in North America. Please note: I'm a sticker for profit as it's the only cattle fad I have. The head, hide and color don't mean too much to me.

Charolais Banner Oct. 1968 - It was in Holland, the homeland of the Black & White Holsteins that I was born and raised, and it was not on a farm either. My father had a feed business and when I quit school, (much too early I found out later), I went to work at the feed business at home.

However, I was always interested in farming, and also either coming to Canada or the States, and finally Canada won out, when I managed to get enough money for a boat ticket, and landed in Halifax in April 1930, with the idea of being a farmer, so I thought. But the hard work, long days and low pay made me do some thinking. I decided that more education would not be a bad idea, so next year I enrolled at the Agricultural College in Guelph, and graduated from there in 1936.

But jobs were still not plentiful, and it was not until 1938 that I finally got to work for one of the big Feed and Fertilizer Companies, and was with them for four years. While on the road as a salesman, I found out that there was a feed business for sale in Aylmer, and I decided that I wanted to work for myself so the deal was made in 1942, and I was in business.

Farming still appealed to me, and in 1950 I was offered a farm with everything on it, and it did not take long to make up my mind, so the deal was made and I was a farmer. The cattle on the farm were Holsteins, and it stayed this way until I heard stories about Charolais and the good beef cattle they were. I kept on the lookout for more information and in 1964 I was able to buy four bred cows, and although the price asked for these cows was much more than I had been paying for the Holsteins I had, I bought these Charolais cows, so I could see for myself if they were as good as I was told. This was the beginning and that fall I bought 6 head from a farmer

who had up-bred these from some good Shorthorn cows he owned. When, the next spring, Shirley Branum wanted to sell her herd, I went to see it, and bought 29 head from her. It was not too long afterwards that I had more Charolais than Holsteins, and the Holsteins were sold that spring.

The herd has been entered on the Ontario Beef Cattle Performance Testing Program, so I will know what each cow in the herd does. French bulls have been and are being used, and some top domestic females have been added. I am inclined to think that the best Charolais will be developed from crossing our best domestic cattle with the pure French. But should this prove wrong, I hope to have a number of pure French Charolais as well.

Operating a farm and breeding Charolais cattle gives a man unlimited scope to use his brains, and use his energy to do the work. But at the same time I believe the following lines contain a lot of truth, "Man has been given two ends, one to sit with, one to think with. It depends which end you use the most, for head you win, and tails you lose."

Charolais Banner Nov. 1966 - I was born and raised on the farm west of Wetaskiwin, AB, where I have lived all my life. Earlier years were spent mainly at mixed farming, gradually increasing the numbers of beef animals we had, which consisted mainly of Shorthorn and Hereford breeding. I also had a few purebred Herefords, using a registered Hereford bull on the two breeds. We were reasonably satisfied with the cross-breeds, but when it came to the straight bred, all I can say is that they were nice to look at, but when it came to gainability, they were tail enders.	
It was in 1957 that I met Anne in our fair city of Wetaskiwin our homes were not more than twenty miles apart. We were married in 1958. This was also the year I read a few articles on Charolais that got the ball rolling. We bred two of our cows AI to Charolais and the next spring, after seeing these calves grow for just a few weeks, I was convinced this was it.	
Shortly after learning that the late Ray Branum had Charolais in Canada, we paid him a visit. I am proud to say that I learned a ABC's of the Charolais breed from Ray, and purchased two 13/16 yearling heifers before leaving.	

We increased our herd by cross breeding and buying females from various herds of the US. Our last ones being from the Litton Charolais Ranch and Bill Lamme of Laclede, Missouri. We imported three heifers from France in 1966 and 1967

Through A.I. we have been able to use some of the best bulls in North America, By way of performance testing and culling, we hope to someday reach the “Hi Standard” for which we have set out goal. I believe there is always room for improvement.

My favorite sport is hunting, Two other fellows and I have hunted some 15 odd years and have been successful every year, although once in a while a moose gets in the way. This fall I will be on a hunt into the wilderness making a try for Caribou. We will be taking two or our horses to ride - we have second and third generation thoroughbreds.

I will say that by visiting fellow Charolais breeders, we have seen some tremendous cattle and made some wonderful friend, people we would never have met had it not been for the Charolais breed.

In the 1964 Charolais Newsletter Winston wrote: I spent all of my early years here in the Columbia Valley on the farm which I later bought from my father. At the age of seventeen I decided that there was bigger money elsewhere to be made, and I went driving team on the construction of the “Big Bend Highway”. After two years, with still itchy feet, I decided to move on, winding up with the CM & S Co. at Trail, BC where I worked for nearly four years. War broke out and I was away again. I joined the Air Force which kept me occupied for five years, and while stationed at Dafoe, SK I met Val, a Saskatchewan school teacher, and we were married in 1944. In the spring of 1946 I was discharged and returned to the farm at home which now looked greener than any far pasture.

One big setback came in November 1959 when we lost our home by fire, a home which we had worked so hard to build. The bright side of this misfortune was in finding out what wonderful friend and neighbors we had.

Our first enterprise on the farm was to build a herd of registered Herefords. This was followed by a change-over to the dairy business and a herd of registered Ayreshires on ROP test.

It was about this time that I started gathering literature and talking about these white cattle from France. I think Val was beginning to wonder if our next move was to be to France or Mexico, for I now knew for sure that I would like to try the Charolais cattle and so I placed an order with Ed Lyons. He brought us three heifers and a bull from Louisiana. To us this seemed like quite a gamble at the time, but a gamble that we have never regretted. Our first calf crop came from a Charolais bull on our Hereford-Shorthorn cross cows. Of course, we heard many remarks from the neighbours about the color of these calves and it was not until fall when the time to market these big calves came, that people began to realize that, perhaps, we had something. The first two years' calf crops went to Calgary with an average weight of over 600 pounds at weaning time. These weights were so attractive that there was soon a good demand for my bulls. In 1963 I purchased a purebred herd sire from Rodney James. In the fall of 1964 we purchased a few cows from Shirley Branum.
